#### **BAPTISM**

The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month after Mass (except during Lent). Parents must contact the parish office in advance; first-time parents are required to attend a baptism formation session.

#### **SPONSOR CERTIFICATES**

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

#### **ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS**

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the OCIA.

#### **PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK**

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

#### **MARRIAGES**

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Our Easter observance has passed quickly, but as it concludes this Sunday with the feast of Pentecost, it also marks a new beginning. Jesus, having returned to His Father's right hand in heaven, has made good on the promise He made to the disciples. Far from leaving them to their own devices, He ensured that they would receive the Holy Spirit. They would have an ongoing participation in divine life that would sustain them on their journey and animate them in carrying out their mission.

The promised Spirit has been given to us, too. We were baptized with water and the Holy Spirit; at Confirmation, we were sealed with the gifts of the same Spirit. This Advocate, protector and guide is present to us. Our celebration of Pentecost, commemorating the day when the first disciples of Jesus received the Spirit, reminds us of the gift we have been given, and encourages us to put it into action in our daily lives. Allowing ourselves to be led by the Spirit will bring us strength, courage, and peace.

But the outpouring of the Holy Spirit is not only an individual phenomenon. It has always also been communal. The Pentecost event is traditionally viewed as the birth of the Church, because it is the Holy Spirit that maintains communion within the Church and also inspires and sustains the Church's mission in the world. It is the Spirit who enables the Church to proclaim that Jesus is Lord (cf. 1 Cor 12:3). Otherwise, relying only on human energy and inspiration, the Church risks becoming a sterile institution, merely a club, or a social service agency. Jesus has entrusted the continuation of His mission to us, and has ensured that we have the Spirit to enliven and encourage us as missionary disciples. We are called to shape our lives, as individuals and as a community, in ways that welcome new disciples, strengthen existing ones, and contribute to the mission of the Church. Our efforts will be fruitful and effective to the extent they are inspired and guided by the Holy Spirit.

### **Pentecost Sunday**

#### First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Each person has received different manifestations of the same spirit to contribute to the common good of all. All members of the church have been baptized into one body because of our belief in the Holy Spirit, who was sent to us by God.

#### Gospel: John 20:19-23

Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples his hands and his side; and they rejoiced at his presence. He breathed on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power to forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.
