Dear Brothers & Sisters.

This Sunday we have a privileged opportunity to reflect on the gift of the Eucharist, as we observe the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, popularly known as Corpus Christi. This feast day was established in 1264 by Pope Urban IV, at the behest of St. Thomas Aquinas. Ever since, it has been an annual celebration of the tremendous gift of the Real Presence of Jesus – Body, Blood Soul, & Divinity – in the Eucharist.

Jesus takes a risk by coming to us in such a seemingly "ordinary" way, and by making the Sacrament so easily and frequently accessible to us. We can become too familiar with sacred things. Our reception of Holy Communion can become routine, and we can forget what an amazing gift we are given. It is easy for us to grow lax in showing due reverence to the Eucharist, and to justify receiving Communion unworthily. This feast day invites us to renew our appreciation, our reverence, and our devotion to the real presence of our Lord in the Eucharist. It is also an opportunity to correct any bad habits we've gotten into, or to re-establish good ones, when it comes to our reception of Holy Communion.

Everyone is invited to take part in the annual Eucharistic Procession through the streets of downtown Raritan, which will begin from the Shrine Chapel of the Blessed Sacrament at about 12:30 pm, following the Latin Mass. The Procession will visit St. Ann and St. Joseph Churches before returning to the Shrine Chapel for Benediction and fellowship.

This week, the Oratorian priests will be taking our annual retreat in Virginia, returning on Saturday evening. We will be praying for you, and ask to be remembered in your prayers as well.

Corpus Christi

First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.

Often, a woman facing an unexpected pregnancy may not know where she can turn for help and assistance. Pregnancy Help Centers respond to this urgent need every day, embracing expectant mothers with empathy and love. Approximately 2,750 pregnancy help centers across the U.S. offer life-affirming support to pregnant and parenting women in need. These centers 'provide a spectrum of care, resources, and material goods to support new mothers—from diapers and layettes, to referrals for housing and food assistance, and personal mentorship and support. Many also provide certain medical services, including ultrasounds, prenatal and postnatal care.' The most recent reports show that in 2022 alone, pregnancy centers served over 3 million clients, providing an estimated \$367 million in free goods and services." (USCCB)


