Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

#### **ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS**

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the OCIA.

#### **PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK**

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

#### **MARRIAGES**

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.



Dear Brothers & Sisters.

With the unofficial close of summer, I wanted to provide an update on a few recent developments...

Our new Parish Pastoral Council was inaugurated back in the spring, and after a brief summer break, will resume monthly meetings in September. The Pastoral Council is an advisory body that assists the Pastor to articulate a vision for the community and develop strategies for making that vision a reality. Each of our meetings begins with a substantial time of prayer drawn from our rich Catholic tradition (Eucharistic Adoration, Rosary, Stations of the Cross, etc.) and a time of formation. Together we are reading and discussing Forming Intentional Disciples by Sherry Weddell. My hope is that in time, the Pastoral Council will become a nucleus for building a culture of intentional, evangelizing discipleship, with our church as a center of missionary outreach to the surrounding community.

This month, the Pastoral Council is coordinating our involvement in the Branchburg Country Fair on the 27th. If you attend the fair, make sure to stop by our table!

This past week, our Parish Finance Council and Trustees met to review and sign the annual financial report that we are required to submit to the Diocese. We are also preparing the annual report that we share with you, which I plan to present in late October as usual. As always, we are grateful for your ongoing financial support of your parish!

Our Senior Adult Ministry held a couple of successful events over the summer, a Strawberry Festival and a Retro Game Day. This growing ministry aims to help our senior parishioners stay connected to each other and to our church community. The next event will be a special Mass on October 8, followed by a presentation by Sr. Ella Mae MacDonald, MPF, Director of Religious Education at St. Ann's in Raritan.

This month includes two great opportunities for pilgrimage as we near the conclusion of the Holy Year 2025 the Jubilee of Hope. The first will be this coming Saturday the 13th at the Blue Army Shrine in our own Diocese, and the second is the following Saturday the 20th at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC. I hope to see many of you there!

Next week, I will provide an update on the recent upgrades to our buildings and grounds.

# 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### First Reading: Wisdom 9:13-18b

This reading acknowledges that people have had a difficult time attempting to know God's wishes. At times we have difficulty understanding the things that happen on earth. Therefore, learning of things in heaven would have been impossible, except that God sent us wisdom and the Holy Spirit to help us understand him.

#### Second Reading: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

Paul writes to Philemon regarding Onesimus, a slave who ran away and encountered Paul. Although Paul wished Onesimus could remain with him, he did not want to violate Philemon's wishes. Paul asks that Philemon receives his friend Onesimus as a beloved brother, not as a slave. He closes by saying, "Welcome him as you would me."

#### Gospel: Luke 14:25-33

Jesus warns people who wish to follow him that they must abandon everyone else first. A person calculates the amount of money needed to complete a project before they begin it. In the same way, Jesus warns these people to consider exactly what is involved before they make a commitment to follow him.


