BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month after Mass (except during Lent). Parents must contact the parish office in advance; first-time parents are required to attend a baptism formation session.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the OCIA.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

MARRIAGES

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

"Lay hold of eternal life," St. Paul writes to Timothy in this Sunday's second reading at Mass (1 Tim 6:12). His words imply action, they suggest a dynamism that should propel us forward towards our fulfillment.

Do we actively pursue eternal life? Do we even understand what eternal life means, and why we should desire it?

I remember that once, when I was a kid, I told my mom that I wasn't sure I wanted to go to heaven, because eventually I would run out of things to do and become bored. My understanding of eternity was that it's just a really, really, long time. If anything, that sounds even less appealing now than it did then. Fortunately, it's also incorrect!

Eternal life is not merely a very long time, an endless extension of the life we already have. Eternity is a state of being outside of time, where there is no change. Eternal life is being in total communion with God, who is eternal. It is the total fulfillment of our longing to love and to be loved unconditionally and permanently. It is good that in eternity there is no change, because it means that once attained, this perfect life can never be lost. While our understanding is limited, we can know that experiencing this all-consuming communion will never become boring!

While eternal life is fundamentally a gift from God, "who gives life to all things" (1 Tim 6:13), it is not automatic. Contrary to popular belief today, everyone does not automatically go to heaven. To "lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called" is to respond to God's initiative in order to receive this ultimate gift. St. Paul lists ways that we do so: "pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness" (1 Tim 6:11). The purpose of our faith, of our discipleship of Jesus, is so that we can lay hold of eternal life. This life is a gift that we cannot earn or deserve, but we can prepare ourselves to receive it by an active pursuit of virtue, aided by God's grace.

The 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4-7

Amos denounces the selfish attitude of those who surround themselves with luxuries with no concern for others. He goes on to warn that because these people lacked interest in the state of their society, they would be the first to be exiled.

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11-16

Paul tells Timothy to seek integrity, faith and love. Paul urges him to attain everlasting life by maintaining strong faith in Jesus and in God until Jesus returns.

Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

Jesus tells of a rich man who feasted daily, while a beggar named Lazarus went hungry outside his gates. When both men died, Lazarus was taken to Abraham, but the rich man was in torment. When he begged for mercy, Abraham reminded him that Lazarus had lived in torment, while the rich man lived in selfish luxury. The man then asked if Lazarus could be sent to his brothers to warn them. But Abraham said if they had not heeded Moses or the prophets, they would ignore even the warning of one risen from the dead.
