BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month after Mass (except during Lent). Parents must contact the parish office in advance; first-time parents are required to attend a baptism formation session.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the OCIA.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

MARRIAGES

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.



Dear Brothers & Sisters,

This Sunday's Gospel focuses on another of my favorite themes in the spiritual life, something I think is nearly as important as the gratitude we reflected on last Sunday. We hear a humorous story that reminds us of the importance of perseverance, especially in prayer, as a key to spiritual "success."

How easily we give up when things become difficult! Living as we do in an age of modern conveniences and instant gratification, it is difficult for us to be patient and persistent in the face of challenges. When things come easily, we do not have to put much effort in or think very much about our choices. But when things are more challenging, we have a choice to make: is it worth spending the time and energy. putting in the extra effort? We must decide whether our goals are important enough to pursue with tenacity and determination. In the spiritual life, we encounter many distractions and temptations to cut corners or to neglect prayer entirely. In the relentless press of daily concerns, which are right before us and often overwhelming – the car needs an oil change, the lawn is three feet high, the kids have soccer practice, the boss called me in on Saturday, etc. – time and space for prayer can end up last on the list, if it makes the list at all. When we do pray, it can be dry and distracted, and we can feel as though nothing is happening and it is a waste of time. We can easily become discouraged – this is the most effective tactic of Satan – and either resign ourselves to mediocrity or give up entirely.

The story Jesus tells in this Sunday's Gospel reminds us of the need for perseverance and of its effectiveness. The goal of our life of prayer is to allow ourselves to be transformed by grace, to let the power of God's love penetrate the depths of our being so that we can live up to the image of God in us. In short, it is to become saints by becoming the people we were created to be. Now this is a goal worth persevering for! When we commit ourselves to prayer, making it a daily priority regardless of how we feel or what is going on, we give God permission to do His work in us, often quietly and behind the scenes. We allow His mercy to heal us and His strength to build us up, not only to be able to flourish in this life, but to embrace and enjoy the
