BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the first Sunday of the month after Mass (except during Lent). Parents must contact the parish office in advance; first-time parents are required to attend a baptism formation session.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholics who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish office.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the parish office for more information about the OCIA.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Please call the parish office to arrange for a pastoral visit, Anointing of the Sick, and/or Holy Communion for those who are ill or elderly and unable to come to church.

MARRIAGES

Arrangements should be made one year in advance of the wedding. Please contact the parish office before booking a reception venue. Once a wedding date is confirmed, a priest or deacon will assist with the required marriage preparation process.

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

November begins with the Feast of All Saints, which calls us to recognize that indeed we are all made for holiness. St. Philip Neri taught us that anyone, in any occupation or state in life, can become a saint, but also that it does not ordinarily happen overnight. Our ultimate fulfillment is to be found through living a holy life as disciples of Jesus, so that we can be numbered among the inhabitants of heaven, whose joyful song resounds for all eternity. May this feast inspire us to pursue holiness, and strengthen us to persevere in our quest.

All Saints Day is immediately followed by All Souls Day, the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed, which falls on Sunday this year. We are reminded of the privilege and responsibility that we all share to pray for our deceased brothers and sisters. We believe that our prayers can truly aid those who are experiencing the purifying fire of purgatory on their way to heaven. Here at Holy Trinity, our observance of this time of prayer for the dead includes two special moments this weekend:

Our annual Mass of Remembrance, on Saturday at the 5:00 Mass. During this Mass, we recall the members and friends of our parish who have died over the past year, inviting their family members to light candles in their honor as their names are read.

This Sunday, at the 10:30 Mass, our Rosary Altar Society will keep the tradition of commemorating their deceased members by reading their names while we pray for them as a community.

Supporting a Culture of Lief



"As Catholics approach the polls, we are asked to weigh many important issues. The U.S. bishops have reaffirmed that 'the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed.' While they did warn us not to 'dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty, and the death penalty,' they did give priority to upholding and defending our brothers' and sisters' most basic right-to live. People of good will must boldly stand up against this intrinsic evil, especially when it is occurring on a massive scale, implemented in law and funded, in some instances, by the government. As believers and citizens inspired by the Gospel and guided by the shepherds of our Church, we must do what we can to end violence in the womb, to ensure that unborn children are fully recognized and protected by our laws, and to support mothers and fathers in embracing life." 
