WEEKLY REFLECTION

Exodus 3:1-8

When God first manifested himself to Moses, He identified himself as the god of Abraham, the god of Isaac, and the god of Jacob. God promised Abraham that he would become the father of a great nation which would occupy a large area of land in what we call the Middle East. Four centuries later the promise of a large number of descendants had been fulfilled. Unfortunately these descendants were slaves of the Egyptians. The land of the promise was not theirs yet.

God told Moses that He had heard the cries of His people. Moses is called to be God's instrument in leading His people out of slavery. The call of Moses is similar to call of many of the prophets of the Old Testament. Like Isaiah and Jeremiah, he was reluctant to accept the mission from God. He made numerous excuses. He claimed he did not know God's name. "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" (Exodus 3:11) He feared that the people would not believe him. He claimed that he did not have the ability to speak. God answered each of these objections, and Moses complied with God's directives.

I can sympathize with Moses. The task ahead of him was monumental. After he had led the people safely out of the control of the Egyptians, he had to deal with their rebellion and idolatry for forty years. We ourselves can be reluctant to accept a call from God because of the challenges and sacrifices it may entail. In our Lenten prayer, let us ask for a deeper awareness of our mission from God and for the strength to implement it.

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **CENTRAL PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Moxy Hotel (formerly the Quality Inn), near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET**. When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
