WEEKLY REFLECTION
Trinity Sunday
Romans 5:1-5

We tend to tolerate boasting in small quantities. We avoid habitual braggarts because we consider such self-promotion to be distasteful at best. The Apostle Paul found particularly obnoxious the boasting of those Pharisees who claimed to observe the Mosaic law perfectly. On the other hand, he had no problem boasting about the work of God. The unmerited grace of God gives us hope. We do nothing to deserve His forgiveness and the promise of the resurrection. (Romans 5:2)

When Paul says “we even boast of our afflictions,” (Romans 5:3) he is not taking pride in his own virtue or in his ability to endure suffering. His focus is on the work of God in us, leading us through the challenges of life as faithful Christians. It is only through God’s grace that the trials we endure develop our character. Frustration, disappointment, and defeat have the potential to form us into more patient, more understanding, and more compassionate followers of Jesus. They can also produce in us bitterness, anger, and resentment.

None of us wants to bring suffering upon himself or herself. We have a natural preference to avoid painful realities. Paul asserts that afflictions can lead to hope in God’s powerful intervention on our behalf. Paul was able to endure many trials because of his confidence in the love of God. “The love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.” (Romans 5:5)

Let us pray that we may have greater confidence in the power of the Holy Spirit who encourages and strengthens us in the challenges of everyday life and gives us the hope that we will share Christ’s victory over death in the resurrection.

HEALTH SCREENINGS AT OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY CHURCH 3368 ESPLANADE AVENUE



VASCULAR AND ABDOMINAL ULTRASOUND SCREENINGS on June 21st and 22nd, 2019

Rightway Imaging will be bringing its mobile unit to **Our Lady of Rosary** to perform 9 vascular and abdominal ultrasound screenings which are non-invasive and painless. They will be screening:

The **Carotid Arteries** on both sides of the neck checking for fatty plaque build-up and blockage. (This is the #1 Cause of Stroke.)

The **Thyroid** for cysts, masses, and unusual growth which is very common among women.

The **Lower Abdominal Aorta** for aneurysms which can go unnoticed until the point of rupture.

The **Liver, Spleen, Gallbladder**, and both **Right and Left Kidneys** for cysts, masses, unusual growth, kidney stones, and gallstones, which can go unnoticed until pain begins and can be a good indicator of future issues of the body.

And finally, they will be offering an **Electrocardiogram** monitoring heart activity for Afibulation.

These are tests that are NOT performed on routine physicals, nor will insurance companies pay for them unless you are symptomatic. In a hospital, these tests could cost thousands collectively. They will offer these test for \$45 each, or all 8 screenings for \$159.00, **which is about \$17 per test.**

If you are: over the age of 35, a smoker, physically inactive, or if you have: high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, or family history of stroke, heart disease, or cancer, please take advantage of these tests.

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **CENTRAL PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET.** When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
