WEEKLY REFLECTION Luke 10:38-42

Many passages of Scripture can be difficult to understand if one does not appreciate the cultural background of the author and his audience. On the other hand, there are some passages that are easily understandable because lessons and examples relate to our culture as well. One of the great examples of the latter is the story of Jesus' visit to the home of the sisters Martha and Mary related in the tenth chapter of the Gospel of Luke.

While Martha was busy preparing to serve a meal to Jesus and his disciples, her sister Mary sat at the feet of Jesus listening to his teaching about the Kingdom of God. Martha asked to Jesus to tell Mary to help her with the household duties. You and I can easily relate to this situation. Frequently people perceive their relatives, their business associates, or their friends as neglecting to do their share of work in whatever business is at hand.

Jesus does not grant Martha's request to dismiss Mary so she can help with the dinner preparations. He said "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it shall not be taken from her." (Luke 10:41-42)

Mary was attentive to Jesus' teaching about the Kingdom of God. Martha considered the duties of hospitality more urgent. By allowing her sense of urgency and responsibility to cloud her vision, she neglected attention to the word of God in Jesus' teaching.

The same temptation is present in our lives as well. It very easy for us to be so preoccupied with meeting deadlines, planning schedules, fulfilling duties that we fail to hear Jesus' teaching us that Kingdom means we surrender those things in which find our glory. For Jesus the Kingdom means that we accept the Father's will. Jesus challenged Martha, and he challenges us to put aside our perfectionism, our disordered desire to be praised for our personal responsibility, and our need to be in control in all circumstances.

Let us pray to be open to the Spirit as we acknowledge the sovereignty of God over our daily decisions.


NEWS FROM AROUND THE ARCHDIOCESE

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **CENTRAL PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET**. When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
