WEEKLY REFLECTION

A few decades ago, there was a call to alter the beautiful hymn Amazing Grace to remove the words "a wretch like me." Apparently, people thought that wretch was too humiliating. They argued that children of God should not debase themselves by using the term wretch. And, they have a point.

Too often we think being humble means degradation. This is almost an Ash Wednesday attitude. It is the attitude that sees our unworthiness in the eyes of God. As Abraham says in this Sunday's first reading, we sinners are "but dust and ashes" and so deserving of God's just judgment (Gen 18:27).

While there is nothing theologically untrue about that attitude, it is not the whole story. Abraham recognized that he was mere dust and ashes, but he also recognized that he was something more: a beloved child of God. He is so confident of his status as beloved that he goes on to haggle and harass God about saving the people of Sodom. In his own words, "see how I am presuming to speak to my Lord" (Gen 18:27).

Abraham truly understands humility. Humility does not mean that we are worthless. It does not mean that we are just dust and ash. True humility is recognizing who you really are: not God but still a beloved child of God.

We typically get half of humility right. We readily understand that we should not be too proud and think ourselves higher than we are. But the opposite is also necessary. We should not debase ourselves and ignore our true value as adopted children of God and brothers and sisters of Christ.

Real humility is a virtue of moderation: never too high and never too low. Abraham proclaims himself but dust in comparison with God, which is true, but he also knows his value as God's son. That is why he can come before God and make his presumptuous case.

The words of Amazing Grace are just fine as they are. We need to recognize that we are but dust and ash as we do on Ash Wednesday, yet we must also recognize our status as God's treasured children.

Lord Jesus Christ, give us the grace to know ourselves as we truly are. Help us to recognize that we are totally dependent on you and can do nothing on our own, but help us also recognize our infinite worth as children created in your own image. Amen.

THE FIRST PRINCIPLE AND FOUNDATION

From the Spiritual Exercises [23] of Ignatius of Loyola

God created human beings to praise, reverence, and serve God, and by doing this, to save their souls.

God created all other things on the face of the earth to help fulfill this purpose.

From this it follows that we are to use the things of this world only to the extent that they help us to this end, and we ought to rid ourselves of the things of this world to the extent that they get in the way of this end.

For this it is necessary to make ourselves indifferent to all created things as much as we are able, so that we do not necessarily want health rather than sickness, riches rather than poverty, honor rather than dishonor, a long rather than a short life, and so in all the rest, so that we ultimately desire and choose only what is most conducive for us to the end for which God created us.

RECOVERY FROM WATER DAMAGE FROM IULY 10 FLOOD

On Wednesday July 10, the Central Business District experienced a deluge of over 11 inches of rain in about three hours. The parish offices on the first floor of the rectory were filled with over ten inches of water.

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **CENTRAL PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET**. When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
