WEEKLY REFLECTION

There is a large difference between knowing something as a fact and knowing it in your heart. St. Ignatius recognized that this distinction between knowledge and "interior knowledge" made all the difference. By interior knowledge, Ignatius meant the phenomenon that happens when the things you know move from your head to your heart.

For example, it is one thing to know that there are many thousands of starving people in the world. It is another thing, however, to see a picture of them, or even more jarring, to actually meet them. In the case where you have a more personal encounter, the knowledge of their situation moves from your head right to your heart. It is a knowledge that forces you to move. It may spur you to turn and run away or it may push you to act on their behalf. In any case, you are left changed.

One of the stated goals of the Spiritual Exercises is to gain "an interior knowledge of Our Lord" (SpEx, 104). Ignatius hoped that his Exercises would move people to meet Jesus in a personal way so that our knowledge of him does not remain merely an intellectual thing. The whole purpose of praying with Christ's life is so that we can be changed in our hearts by an interior knowledge of him.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus tells us how to live as Christians. We should not fear nor worry about the treasures of this world but live in total anticipation of the Lord's return. We should live every moment as if Christ were about to come.

But, who among us actually lives that way? Sadly, too few of us, myself included. The problem, it seems, is that we rely too often on mere intellectual knowledge. I know that God created everything, sent his Son for my redemption, and has forgiven me my sins. I am aware that I should not worry about the things of this world and that I should live as if every moment belonged to the Lord. But, do I know it in my heart?

If we hope to live as if everything was the Lord's, as if everything depended upon the Lord, and as if nothing else mattered, then we need to beg for this interior knowledge. Only then will we be changed. Only then will we be moved.

Lord, we beg you to help us know your Son in our hearts. Help us to really know so that we can really love.

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Immaculate Conception Jesuit Church:

Thank you for your support of the church and our various ministries to people in need. As members of the parish and friends of the church, you need to know how your contributions are being used.

For the 2019 fiscal year which ended on June 30, we had a surplus primarily because of Extraordinary Church Income from weddings. We will have fewer weddings in fiscal 2020, so we expect a reduction in Extraordinary Church Income.

In fiscal 2019 there were significant expenses for repairs and maintenance of the church building. We expect to spend even more in fiscal 2020 for repairs and upkeep of the church. The increased spending in this area accounts for most of the increase in Other Expenses.

The diocesan assessment supports the many ministries of the archdiocese.

We anticipate having to do maintenance work on the interior walls of the church which will necessitate the erection of scaffolding. Any surplus the parish realizes is transferred to the maintenance fund, so we can finance this very expensive project.

The activity of the account of the ministry to the poor does not appear in this report. This ministry assists families who need emergency help in paying their rent and utilities bills. Fortunately donations to this ministry increased in 2019. As a result the parish was able to provide almost \$60,000 in emergency assistance for utilities and rent.

If we are to keep our budget balanced, we will need weekly contributions totaling \$9,925.

Thank you for doing your part to support the church and its various ministries.

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **CENTRAL PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET**. When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
