WEEKLY REFLECTION

God delivered the Hebrew people from their slavery in Egypt, led them through their journey in the desert, and opened the way for them to enter the Promised Land which the Canaanites occupied. The Law given to His people on Mount Sinai made it clear that He was their God and they were His people. Immediately after their liberation from Pharaoh, the chosen people began to rebel against God's plan. They fell into idolatry almost immediately after escaping from Egypt. After they entered the Promised Land, they began to adopt some of the customs of the Canaanites and at times worshiped their gods.

The Law given through Moses provided for rituals, customs, and prohibitions which reminded God's people of their status as His special nation. Separation from the Gentiles was not based on arrogance or inhospitality but on the reality that mixing with the Gentiles would lead to idolatry, infidelity, and other areas of sinfulness.

Jesus understood his mission as limited to the "lost sheep of the house of Israel." (Matthew 15:24). His flippant remark equating Gentiles with dogs corresponds to the prevailing attitudes of his people who understood that God forbade contact with Gentiles for very good reasons.

Jesus' healing of the Canaanite's woman's daughter pointed to the future mission of the Church to the Gentiles. She responded to Jesus with great faith. "Jesus said to her in reply, 'O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.' And her daughter was healed from that hour." (Matthew 15:28)

The early Christians of Jewish background understood Matthew's message. One's ethnicity does not matter in the Christian community. What is truly important is coming to Jesus in faith. It is our experience of Jesus calling us to deeper faith that unites all Christian believers. The apostle Paul makes it clear, "For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, the same Lord is Lord of all and bestows his riches upon all who call upon him." (Romans 10:12) What unites us in Christ Jesus is far more important for us than what divides us.

When encountering the forces of division, let us remind ourselves of truth of our unity revealed in Christ.

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **SP PLUS PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET**. When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
