WEEKLY REFLECTION Matthew 18:21-35

We naturally assume that although human beings are motivated by self-interest one can altruistically make sacrifices to benefit others. But surrendering oneself for others is not the only way humans act contrary to their own interest.

One of the most common forms of self-defeating behavior is holding on to resentment. Refusing to forgive and forget can have significant negative effects. For some people bitterness is such a part of their lives that it seems that their resentments are their best friends.

Living in the past and nursing hurts from years gone by does us more harm than good. We cannot change the past. An insult we received years ago may have stung us then. What good is it for us to relive that sting day-by-day in the present? We may have been deceived by a trusted friend or relative. The duplicity of others may have cost us financially or emotionally. Dwelling on that loss will not undo the offense or restore what we lost.

We can imprison ourselves by holding on to the past. No matter how much we demand it, we cannot change what happened in the past. It can be helpful to seek compensation or an apology in the hope that we could then have closure. If others do not provide recompense or ask for forgiveness, it is better for us to let the matter go.

Clinging to anger is unhealthy for us. Happy, healthy, and free persons refuse to concentrate their energy on parts of their lives where they have no control. Spending our time where we have no control only increases frustration, anger, and discouragement.

We can choose to live a prison of anger and resentment. Forgiveness sets us free.
