#### WEEKLY REFLECTION Isaiah 40:1-11

The first vocal movement in Handel's *Messiah* proclaims God's message from the book of the prophet Isaiah, "Comfort ye, comfort ye my people." (Isaiah 40:1) The consoling message comes to God's people as the Babylonian Empire collapsed and the new Persian rulers allowed them to return to their homeland. To prepare for God and His people's return to Jerusalem every valley is to be filled in and every mountain to be made low.

This passage has special meaning for us as we celebrate the season of Advent. We are called to "make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God." (Isaiah 40:3) We prepare to celebrate the coming of God among us in the person of His Son, Jesus Christ. Advent gives us an opportunity to reflect on those barriers we place around us that have prevented the coming of God into our lives.

The valleys and high places remind us of our attitudes that have become obstacles to the Lord's entering into our daily lives. We may complacently sit on one those high hills that we create in our arrogance. We may act in our daily lives in such a way that we feel no dependence on God or need for His wisdom and direction in our lives. On the other hand, we may live in a valley of discouragement which may be an obstacle to God's coming to us. We may be disheartened by our repeated failures in our attempts to do God's will and draw closer to Him. Whether it is our independence and self-sufficiency or our discouragement and frustration that block God from coming to us, Advent provides us the opportunity for us to reflect on the power of God who comes to reconcile and heal us.

Let us pray for the insight to see where we place barriers that prevent the Lord's coming to us. Let us pray for the courage to change so we can welcome the Lord who challenges and consoles us.
