WEEKLY REFLECTION
Amos 7:12-15

Most of the Old Testament prophets were reluctant to undertake the mission of speaking on behalf of God in calling his people to repentance. Jeremiah protested that he was too young and did not know how to speak. (Jeremiah 1:6) Amos responded to the call of God to leave the southern kingdom of Judah and go to the northern kingdom of Israel to preach at the national shrine at Bethel. He would have been content with tending his orchard and watching over his sheep. (Amos 7:14-15)

Amos encountered the hostility of the professional prophets who were associated with the official shrine. Amos spoke bluntly about the infidelity of the king and the people. God demand justice and concern for the oppressed. The nation of Israel had forgotten the true worship of God. The ruling class lived in luxury while exploiting the vulnerable though dishonesty and trickery. He used strong language to communicate God's displeasure with the leaders of the nation, and he warned of impending disaster. The nation would be destroyed by an invading army. His prophecy was tragically fulfilled a few decades later when the Assyrians conquered the nation.

His message posed a threat to the established order. He was told to go back home and prophesy there. The hostile reaction of the priests of the temple shrine is understandable. None of us enjoys being denounced for hypocrisy and infidelity. Most of us would find intolerable the condemnations that Amos directed at the leadership of Israel.

A prophet like Amos would find much to criticize in contemporary American society. Our culture has been hijacked by materialism and hedonism. An epidemic of profound personal unhappiness emerges where self-indulgence replaces self-discipline and self-pity replaces personal responsibility. Unlimited personal autonomy has become the idol of our society. We seem to be powerless to control violence and anti-social behavior. Truth is irrelevant for those determined to expand their political and economic power.

Let us pray that we may listen to the call of the prophets to turn away from our disordered demands for our personal status, comfort, and control. May we embrace the truth that frees us to be people of reconciliation and charity.

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **SP PLUS PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET.** When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
