WEEKLY REFLECTION Revelation 5:11-14

In the Gospel of John, Jesus hung on the cross for three hours beginning at noon on the preparation day for the Passover. The lambs for the Passover feast were slaughtered at that hour. John made a connection between the death of Jesus and the death of lambs whose blood was smeared on the doorposts of the Hebrews as they prepared to flee slavery in Egypt. The sacrifice of the Passover lamb through the ages served as a reminder of God's mighty acts in delivering his people from slavery. Through his sacrificial death, Jesus as the Lamb of God brought liberation from sin and death.

In the Book of Revelation, the narrator was taken to the heavenly throne room. The question arose, who is worthy to open the seals on the scroll which contained God's redemptive purposes for mankind. No one seemed to be worthy until the figure referred to as the Lamb appeared. He was introduced with these words, "the lion of the tribe of Judah, the root of David, has triumphed, enabling him to open the scroll with its seven seals." (Revelation 5:5) John reported seeing "a Lamb that seemed to have been slain. He had seven horns and seven eyes." (Revelation 5:6)

The reader might expect a lion, the symbol of power and strength, to enter, but a lamb appeared instead. Throughout the Old and New Testaments, lambs represented vulnerability. The Good Shepherd protected his defenseless sheep. In a parable about the mercy of God, a shepherd searches for his lost sheep. The Lamb in Revelation had been slain like the sacrificial lambs of the Old Testament, but the Lamb had seven horns, which is symbolic of the height of power. The Lamb is worthy to open the scroll because he endured the cross. In his resurrection he triumphed over the forces of evil. Because of his sacrifice, the risen Christ depicted as the Lamb is worthy to open the scroll and thus begin the completion of God's purpose for the universe. "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing." (Revelation 5:11)

In the Book of Revelation, the Lamb was given dominion over all of creation. His power came through his suffering and acceptance of the Father's purpose. Rather than symbolizing innocent submission, the Lamb in Revelation represents the glorified Christ enthroned with God and destined to be victorious over all of the human and demonic forces opposed to God's will.

Before Communion at Mass we say, "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us." Let us pray we may have confidence in the sovereign power of Jesus Christ who has triumphed our enemies, sin, death, and the power of evil. May confidence in the power of Christ strengthen us as we face our challenges.

NOTRE DAME SEMINARY PROGRAMS FOR LAITY

The Notre Dame Seminary Programs for Laity is excited to announce that we have adopted a new curriculum for the Institute for Lay Ecclesial Ministry (ILEM) and Master of Arts in Pastoral Leadership (MAPL) programs. Under this new curriculum, students can earn a MAPL degree in as few as three years while enrolled on a part-time basis. Furthermore, all accepted students are eligible to receive the Handing on the Faith Scholarship, which reduces tuition by 75%. CANNONBALL CONVERSATIONS

"Cannonball Conversations," a lunchtime speaker series hosted by Immaculate Conception (Jesuit) Church in honor of the current international Ignatian Year, is delighted to welcome Tania Tetlow, J.D., President of Loyola University New Orleans, on Tuesday, May 3, at 12:30 pm. After taking the helm of the 110-year-old institution in 2018, she has led it successfully through a financial crisis, natural disasters, and a world-wide pandemic. Later this summer, she will bid her beloved hometown of New Orleans adieu in order to assume the presidency of Fordham University in New York, the first woman and layperson to do so. Her talk, "How to Hear God's Voice Without Need of a Cannonball" follows the noon Mass in the church. The 45- minute presentation will include time for Q&A at the end. "Cannonball Conversations" features prominent local voices talking about faith, finding your path, and changing the world. The event will also be live-streamed on the parish YouTube channel. Called for 2021-2022, the Ignatian Year commemorates the 500th Anniversary of St. Ignatius of Loyola's conversion and the 400th of his canonization.

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **SP PLUS PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET**. When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
