WEEKLY REFLECTION

Since every person is complex, it can be difficult to explain a person's behavior by pointing to one single factor. A number of experiences contribute to a person's developing an angry, resentful, and envious attitude toward to the people in his life. On the other hand, many positive nurturing experiences contribute to a person's feelings of optimism and resilience. If it is wrong to attribute an individual's outlook on life to one factor, certainly one can question any attempt to attribute societal changes to one cause.

Although there is no one explanation for the unfortunate changes in American life in past 50 years, there can be no doubt that the absence of fathers in the home has contributed significantly to our cultural decline. The heroic sacrifices made by single mothers deserve our admiration. Unfortunately there are some families that must be separated from the father the because of the danger his presence poses to the family's health and wellbeing. Nonetheless, in most instances the truth remains that children fare better in households with a father and a mother.

The United States leads the world in the percentage of children living in single-parent households. Many studies have shown that boys without a father in the home have an elevated risk of involvement in crime. Children from fatherless homes are more likely to become involved in drug and alcohol abuse, drop out of school, and suffer from health and emotional problems.

The past few decades have witnessed a significant decline in respect for others and for societal institutions. In popular culture the role of the father has been trivialized and mocked. Jim Anderson of the 1960's television show *Father Knows Best* presented a wise, hard-working, self-controlled, and loving father. He no longer represents what the popular culture associates with fatherhood. He has been replaced by Homer Simpson, a self-indulgent, lazy buffoon.

The loss of self-respect among our youth is a great tragedy. Self-respect makes it easier for us to develop habits of personal responsibility, empathy for others, and willingness to make sacrifices for the greater good. Lack of self-respect can lead to feelings of helplessness or antisocial behavior.

Let us thank the fathers we know who provide an example of dedication, purposefulness, self-control, and generosity. May God bless all families and all fathers. May all fathers grow in the gifts of the Sprit, especially wisdom, counsel, and fortitude.


OCBM JUNETEENTH COMMEMORATION

MISSION APPEAL FOR THE SISTERS OF THE DESTITUTE

On the weekend of July 9-10 Sister Suny Augustine of the Sisters of the Destitute will speak at all of the Masses about the charitable work of her congregation. The congregation was founded in India in 1927. Eighteen hundred sisters work in 13 countries. They care for the aged and the destitute as well as the terminally ill cancer and AIDS patients. They organize family welfare services in slums and villages. They have a ministry to prisoners and addicts. In Madagascar they operate 6 schools for some of the poorest children in the country.

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **SP PLUS PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET.** When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
