WEEKLY REFLECTION

A recent Gallup Poll found that 78% of Americans agree that the country is headed in the wrong direction. Citizens with diametrically opposed views of politics, religion, and society are concerned about the future of the nation.

Some find the cause of the problem in younger generations that do not share the values of earlier generations. Of course this complaint has existed for millennia. The ancient Greek philosopher Socrates lamented, "The children now love luxury; they have bad manners, contempt for authority; they show disrespect for elders." Although intergenerational conflict seems to be a part of the human condition, some of today's youth in Western societies seem to be more alienated, anxious, and depressed than earlier generations of young people. On the other hand, many young people today appear to negotiate adolescence and young adulthood with relative ease.

Parents, teachers, and the church have a responsibility for the emotional and character development of children. We succeed when young people develop resilience, a moral compass, and a sense of purpose. Unfortunately so much of our contemporary society conspires against us in the work of developing happy and productive young adults.

It can be difficult to develop a moral compass if the media and other influences insist that all truth is relative. Today's youth are encouraged to speak "their truth" as if each person is capable of determining what is true for himself or herself. Parents, mentors, and the clergy must counteract this pernicious force and provide examples of people who have lived by moral principles.

Failure is a part of life. Frustration, disappointment, and defeat are not disasters. The older generations need to model resilience so youth can learn that minor setbacks need not be devastating. The exaggeration of obstacles diminishes one's optimism. Someone who chooses to live in victim mode becomes trapped in a spirit of powerlessness.

Contemporary society has seen an increase in young adults, especially young men, who seem to have no ambition. An inordinate fear of failure can make one reluctant to take personal responsibility for the direction of one's life. The contemporary culture encourages immediate gratification of one's desires. It is hard to develop a sense of purpose without having the ability to postpone pleasurable activities and accept one's responsibilities to society.

Let us pray for parents, teachers, and other mentors that they may provide a good example and encourage young people to develop resilience, a sense of purpose, and a moral compass. Let us pray for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in this endeavor because we are engaged in spiritual warfare against relativism, learned helplessness, and confusion.

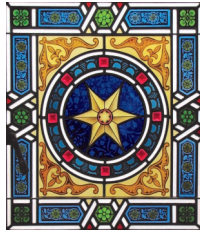

PARKING at 220 O'Keefe

For registered Immaculate Conception parishioners, parking at a reduced fee of \$2.00 for a 3-hour period is available in the **SP PLUS PARKING GARAGE** at 220 O'Keefe, next to the Quality Inn, near the corner of O'Keefe and Common. The garage is open to parishioners for regularly-scheduled parish Masses on the weekend.

To get the reduced rate, for each visit you must use a magnetic voucher card available for purchase in the parish office, or you may order vouchers by completing the form available on the back counter of the church.

To take advantage of the reduced rate, enter the garage from O'Keefe, and take a ticket from the auto attendant. **KEEP YOUR TICKET.** When you exit the garage, you will need to insert both that ticket and the voucher.
