WEEKLY REFLECTION Exodus 32:7-14

Our world is the battleground in the great warfare between the spirit of God and the forces of evil. God's plan for creation meets resistance in the heart of every person because we are all tempted to set up ourselves as the autonomous rulers of creation. The force of evil wins a battle every time we give into the temptation to follow our own plans rather than accept what our loving God has established to bring us true happiness and freedom.

Jesus promised us, "The truth will make you free." (John 8:32) Self-deception leads us to believe the lies that power of evil uses to entice to make decisions that enslave rather than liberate us. One of the greatest of all lies has grown in popularity lately. Many people insist that truth is relative. What is true for you may not be "my truth." An attitude prevalent today says, "If you don't respect 'my truth,' then you don't respect me. If you challenge 'my truth,' you are hateful and deserving of condemnation."

In a world which denies the reality of truth, no one sins. Relativism promises us liberation and autonomy. In reality it enslaves us. If there is no objective truth, one can delude himself into believing that there is no harm in self-destructive and antisocial choices. We are in peril when we deny our sinfulness. The first step to accepting liberation is admitting we are sinners.

In the Book of Exodus, the recently liberated Hebrew people entered into a covenant with God on Mount Sinai. When Moses did not return quickly enough from his encounter with God on the mountain, the people formed a golden bull and worshiped it as the god that led them out of slavery in Egypt. For centuries God's chosen people continued to fall into the sin of idolatry. Exodus portrays Moses as pleading with God not to destroy the people who showed enormous ingratitude in such a dramatic way. "'Remember your servants Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, and how you swore to them by your own self, saying, "I will make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky; and all this land that I promised, I will give your descendants as their perpetual heritage." So the LORD relented in the punishment he had threatened to inflict on his people." (Exodus 32:14)

In today's world idolatry takes many forms. Our desires for status, power, control, approval, comfort and pleasure can become so exaggerated that they become our idols. Our desire for autonomy can distort our view of the world and of God. Yet we can trust that God is faithful to his promises. Let us pray for the grace to see where we may be idolatrous, the grace to change, and the grace to accept God's forgiveness.

THE CATHOLIC BUSINESS LEADER: A New Orleans Symposium

The symposium is a joint collaboration of Xavier University of Louisiana and Loyola University New Orleans with resource assistance from the Catholic Community Foundation of New Orleans that will take place on **September 29**, **2022 through October 1**, **2022**.

This gathering of Catholic business educators, business executives, and civic leaders takes its inspiration from the document *The Vocation of the Business Leader: A Reflection* published in 2014 by the Vatican Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development. Cardinal Peter Turkson, then-prefect of the dicastery, was at the helm of the project and Dr. Michael Naughton, Director for the Center of Catholic Studies at the University of St. Thomas in Minneapolis, was one of the document's main authors.

Cardinal Turkson will give the symposium's keynote address on September 29 at Xavier and Dr. Naughton will chair the first session at Loyola on September 30. Also scheduled as speakers are best-selling author Dr. Chris Lowney, Fr. Nicky Santos, S.J., Rector of the Jesuit Community and Associate Professor in the College of Business at Creighton University, and many other Catholic intellectuals and business leaders from around the country and the greater New Orleans area. The objective of the symposium is to generate dialogues on acknowledging Catholic business leadership as a <u>vocation</u>. This concept draws its nourishment from the font of Catholic Social Teaching's complementary principles of *subsidiarity* (an awareness that all members of the workforce are recognized as made in the image of God or *imago Dei*) and *solidarity* (working towards generating products and services that contribute to the common good). PARKING at 208 O'Keefe

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment.
