WEEKLY REFLECTION

Distorted thinking leads us into unnecessary interpersonal conflicts and intensifies our personal unhappiness by increasing our anxiety, discouragement, and anger. Overgeneralization and all-or-nothing thinking lead us to develop attitudes which result in choices that alienate us from others and deepen our personal unhappiness. So much conflict in family, politics, and society comes from simplistic thinking. We tell ourselves that the other person's thinking is completely false and any opposing viewpoint is totally flawed. The failure to admit that life is not so simple intensifies disagreements and blinds us to the truth.

Few principles are absolutely true. So much conflict in society and politics results from advocates absolutizing their ideas and condemning anyone who objects when they carry them too far. Those who seek to divide us are skilled at targeting anyone who does not see the issues in stark black and white terms. No gray is allowed. Anyone who suggests that reality is more complex than the accepted wisdom risks being "cancelled."

Psychologists and educators have recognized the importance of healthy self-esteem in the development of young people. Low self-esteem manifests itself in feelings of unworthiness, a lack of confidence, and excessive fear. People with a negative self-image have difficulty hearing criticism or even positive feedback. Depression, anxiety, shame, and feelings of inadequacy are formidable obstacles to developing a healthy outlook on life.

Since poor self-esteem can be so debilitating, psychologists and educators teach people how challenge their negative self-talk. Schools have programs to promote positive self-esteem. Unfortunately, the desire to promote good outcomes can become so exaggerated that people loose sight of the truth. Promoting positive self-esteem can be absolutized. It may be a well-intentioned mistake to tell people that they are fine the way they are. It is clearly unhealthy for a person to be preoccupied by negative thoughts about a physical characteristic that cannot be changed. It is far better to accept what we cannot change.

On the other hand, it does not help anyone to be absolved of the responsibility to change what he can change. We do our friends and family a great disservice when we encourage the natural tendency to avoid the difficult work of changing ourselves. We all need encouragement to change habits that negatively affect our physical, emotional, and spiritual health.

May the spirit of truth enlighten us when we are tempted to say, "You are fine the way you are." May the spirit help us to accept the encouragement we need to change ourselves for the better.

Madeline Engel coordinates the parish's Ministry to the Poor. She reports that the majority of our clients are elderly men and women and single mothers. The ministry assists clients with rental deposits, rent, and utilities. We pay the landlords and the utilities directly; no cash is given to clients. On average we assist 20 families each month.

The past several months have been challenging because of the substantial increase in utility bills. We are grateful to our parishioners. Without their support we could not continue the ministry.

PARKING at 208 O'Keefe

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment. Instead of using pre-paid cards, you will enter a one-time code on the Premium Parking app. Details are available on the website www.jesuitchurch.net and on the parish Facebook page Immaculate Conception Jesuit Church. You may bring to church office the cards you previously purchased, and we will give you a list of the one-time access codes. You may come to the church office Monday to Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Upon entering the garage, please enter the six-digit code and your license plate number in the Premium Parking app. You may park for 120 minutes.

The parish will provide special codes for parishioners at the previous rate of \$2.00.
