WEEKLY REFLECTION

Love in not rude; it is not self-seeking

The Apostle Paul had a clear agenda when he wrote to the church in Corinth about the importance of love for the brothers and sisters in the community. Some members of the community of higher social status considered themselves more enlightened and repeatedly reminded those of lesser rank that they were less important than the "spiritually gifted." God gives Christian believers gifts to unite us not to divide us. Speaking in tongues and other dramatic manifestations of the Spirit are special gifts from God. The elitists allowed their special gifts to cause divisions in the community. But Paul reminded them that the greater spiritual gifts unite rather than divide. That is why he encouraged them to strive for the greatest gift, love, which unites and heals all divisions. (1 Corinthians 12.31)

Rudeness emerges from three patterns of thought and behavior. First, many of us become rude when we are frustrated and impatient. Car pool lines at elementary schools are fertile ground for rude behavior because so many people with more important things to do have converged at a time that requires great patience. Secondly, rudeness comes from an arrogance which leads us to say, "My convenience is more important than the needs of everyone else." "I am too important to be frustrated." "No one has a right to expect me to behave in civil manner. I am too important for that." Ignorance leads to a third form rudeness. We could be unaware of how our words or actions are insensitive. The stereotype of the "ugly American" traveling overseas portrays people who are ignorant of the culture of the country they are visiting. Sometimes ignorance of what is offensive comes from an arrogant attitude which says I am too important to learn what is acceptable and what is unacceptable in another culture.

No one wants to be characterized as arrogant, ignorant, and overly impolite. Paul expected Christians to control themselves. "Love is not rude" because rudeness is divisive, whereas love unites.

We have an unfortunate inclination to put our interests ahead of everyone else's. When we insist that our needs be met before those of others, we fall into the arrogance that subverts our responsibility to love. It is all too easy to allow our personal agenda to dominate our relationships with others. Self-indulgence, self-aggrandizement, self-promotion, and self-absorption ultimately emerge from our self-deception. Therefore, it is necessary for us to pray for insight into our behaviors and attitudes. Let us pray that the Spirit of God enlighten us so we may see clearly how pushing our own agenda interferes with our call to love.
