

# WEEKLY REFLECTION Easter

In the earliest centuries of the Church's history, candidates for baptism were immersed in the water. In ancient times some Jewish converts were baptized as a rite of initiation into the faith. The baptism of John the Baptist included immersion in the River Jordan. The flowing waters of baptism symbolized purification through the washing away of sin. When one emerged from the pool of baptism, the new Christian put on new white clothing which symbolized his identification with the risen Jesus.

The Church's guidelines for the baptism of adults recommend that the rite occur in the context of the Easter Vigil in order to bring out the connection between baptism and the resurrection. When the person to be baptized enters the water, he symbolically dies; and when he emerges, he symbolically rises. Baptism signifies a new relationship with Jesus Christ as well as providing a reminder that one is a new person whose life is moving in a new and different direction.

Since the early years of the Church, the rite of baptism has incorporated minor exorcisms. These prayers request God's assistance so that the baptized person will be kept safe from the power of Satan and protected from temptation. Before baptism is administered the candidate is asked about his belief in the doctrines of the faith. The candidates for baptism or the godparents, in the case of a small child, respond to these questions. "Do you reject Satan? And all of his works? And all of his empty promises?"

The power of evil works very effectively in our world. In our contemporary society, many people are tempted to make self-destructive choices that embody the self-hatred that mirrors Satan's hatred for humanity. The alienation, violence, and hostility that tear apart families and societies come from disordered desires for power, comfort, and fame. Our enemy uses our envy to lead us into all kinds of sins.

It is appropriate for us to renew our baptismal promises at Easter. As we celebrate Christ's victory over sin, evil, and the power of death, we reaffirm our commitment to live as children of the Father and brothers and sisters of the Lord. Our connection with Jesus through the Holy Spirit empowers us to approach temptation with confidence and right thinking. In the power of the Holy Spirit, we refuse to be mastered by sin, and we reject the glamor of sin. Let us pray for wisdom and strength in our daily battle with the forces that conspire to weaken and discourage us.

THE EASTER PROCLAMATION (EXSULTET)

Once the Paschal candle is in place, it is incensed and the ancient paschal chant, the Exsultet, is sung. After the Exsultet, all candles are extinguished as we are seated to listen to the story of our salvation.

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment. You may bring to church office the cards you previously purchased, and we will give you a list of the onetime access codes. You may come to the church office Monday to Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Upon entering the garage, please enter the sixdigit code and your license plate number in the Premium Parking app. You may park for 120 minutes.

The parish will provide special codes for parishioners at the previous rate of \$2.00.
