WEEKLY REFLECTION

The intense and bitter partisan divisions we see in today's politics and society are by no means unprecedented in the nation's history. The decade of the 1790s witnessed bitter rivalries and personal animosities that surpass the divisions of our contemporary society. Our current political controversies are mild in comparison with the decades of hostility that marked the early years of the republic. In 1804 the vice-president shot and killed the former secretary of the treasury. An argument on the floor of the House of Representatives between two congressmen became so heated that one spat on the other who in turn beat him with his cane.

The feud between John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the second and third presidents, was as intense as any of the personal and political conflicts we witness today. They served together in the Continental Congress that declared independence. When Washington was president, Adams served as vice president, and Jefferson was secretary of state. They represented conflicting interests in the new nation. Jefferson, a Virginian, defended the interests of agriculture; whereas Adams promoted the interests of the merchant class in the northeastern cities. Adams favored a strong central government that would promote the commerce within the nation and with foreign nations. Jefferson favored strict limits on the power of the federal government. In foreign relations Jefferson favored France. Adams feared the contagion of the French Revolution and took the side of Britain. Adams won the presidential election of 1796. For the next four years, Jefferson undermined Adams because of strong disagreements over the administration's policies. The bitterness intensified when Jefferson won the election of 1800. The quarrelling continued for the next ten years.

In 1812 a mutual friend, Dr. Benjamin Rush, who was also a signer of the Declaration of Independence, encouraged Jefferson and Adams to renew their friendship and put hostilities behind them. They started corresponding again. Their writing covered a wide range of topics. Adams wrote to Jefferson in 1816 that he lamented the restoration of the Jesuits. "If ever there was a body of men who merited damnation on earth and in Hell, it is this society of Loyola's. Nevertheless, we are compelled by our system of religious toleration to offer them an asylum."

We should never allow political disagreements to interfere with our personal and family relationships. We need to guard against allowing principled disagreements to degenerate into personal conflict. We may have allowed disagreements to intensify and become unnecessarily personal. With the help of Dr. Rush, Jefferson and Adams recognized that what they had in common was far more important than what separated them. The bitterness between them was unfortunate and unnecessary. Let us accept the challenge of following Benjamin Rush in bringing together those who have allowed truly unimportant disagreements to divide them. Let us follow their example as we seek reconciliation with someone from whom we have become estranged. Let us be open to the truth that most of our disagreements do not justify separation or hostility.

In a strange coincidence, Adams and Jefferson died on the same day, the fiftieth anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1826.

PARKING at 208 O'Keefe

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment. Instead of using pre-paid cards, you will enter a one-time code on the Premium Parking app. Details are available on the website www.jesuitchurch.net and on the parish Facebook page Immaculate Conception Jesuit Church. You may bring to church office the cards you previously purchased, and we will give you a list of the one-time access codes. You may come to the church office Monday to Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Upon entering the garage, please enter the six-digit code and your license plate number in the Premium Parking app. You may park for 120 minutes.

The parish will provide special codes for parishioners at the previous rate of \$2.00.
