WEEKLY REFLECTION

The disordered quest for the approval of others can lead us to make unfortunate choices that bring us sorrow and disappointment rather than the satisfaction and happiness we seek. The exaggerated need for approval, along with excessive demands for power and control, ambition for greater status, and the refusal to sacrifice comfort, interferes with our call to be people of virtue.

We thrive when we have healthy friendships. There can be times when we value our friendships so much that we cannot tolerate the possibility of losing them. The approval of others can inhibit our making the right choices in life. An exaggerated need for belonging can lead us to surrender our freedom. If we consider losing our friends to be a disaster, we can let fear dominate us and inhibit us from doing or saying what is right. If one's self-worth depends on the approval of someone else, one surrenders his freedom. If one is desperate for a sense of belonging, one may have to sacrifice the truth and other important values.

Adolescents are particularly susceptible to letting the need for approval dominate their lives. The need for approval can hinder the development of a proper sense of autonomy. It is hard to develop one's sense of identity if one's priority is pleasing others. One can become overly reliant on the opinion of others. When one looks for external approval, one may allow one's mood to be controlled by the opinions of others. Adolescents and others who have a high need of approval open themselves to depression and sense of hopelessness if they lose an important person's approval. It is unfortunate when one's sense of self-worth depends on what others say.

We need friendships, but we need to evaluate our friendships in the context of our friendship with God. "Do you not know that to be a lover of the world means enmity with God? Therefore, whoever wants to be a lover of the world makes himself an enemy of God." (James 4:4)

The courage of the apostles in face of persecution for faith provides us a great example. They responded to the religious authorities in Jerusalem with boldness, "But Peter and the apostles said in reply, 'We must obey God rather than men.'" (Acts 5:29) If we are faithful to the mission we have received from God, we will encounter opposition. The prophet Jeremiah, like many of the other prophets, fearlessly proclaimed God's message in the face of virulent opposition. "All day long I am an object of laughter; everyone mocks me. Whenever I speak, I must cry out, violence and outrage I proclaim; the word of the LORD has brought me reproach and derision all day long. But the LORD is with me, like a mighty champion; my persecutors will stumble, they will not prevail. In their failure they will be put to utter shame, to lasting, unforgettable confusion." (Jeremiah 20:7-8)

Jeremiah's confidence in God enabled him to endure great hardship, isolation, and persecution. Their love of God and their friendship with the Lord Jesus, enabled the saints to endure great hardships and even torture.

Let us pray for confidence in God's spirt as we examine our attachment to the approval of others. Let us pray for the grace to be free to do what God wills.
