#### **WEEKLY REFLECTION**

God created us with healthy desires that we exaggerate and distort leading to our unhappiness and the misery of others. Previous weekly reflections have examined how the excessive desire for approval, status, and comfort leads us to make unhealthy decisions. Even more destructive than these distortions is the demand for power or control over others.

The Book of Genesis indicates that the desire to be in total control was a part of the human story from the beginning. The snake tempted Eve saying, "You certainly will not die! God knows well that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, who know good and evil." (Genesis 3:4-5) Adam and Eve were tempted to gain the status of gods. Their demand for power led them to rebel against the sovereignty of God. They were not content to rule over creation in conformity with God's plan. "God blessed them and God said to them: Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and all the living things that crawl on the earth." (Genesis 1:28)

Much of the interpersonal tension we experience in our lives comes from conflicts over who is in control. Every adult is entitled to a certain degree of autonomy. Many conflicts arise when we attempt to exercise power over others in inappropriate ways. So many of our personal conflicts are disputes over trivial matters. The inordinate desire for greater control clouds our thinking. Insignificant matters become issues of principle because we look at reality through a lens distorted by our need to be in control.

Often the conflict within families centers on the question of who is in charge. Parents of young and maturing children and adolescents need to exercise their authority because their experience gives them a better insight into what is best for their children. Of course, as a child grows some areas of control need to be relaxed, but there are other areas that still require parental vigilance. Disagreements are normal part of the process.

Wise parents know that they are not responsible for the decisions of their adult children. It can be difficult to move from a position of authority to one of mentoring and guiding.

Let us pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit. May we gain insight into our excessive demands to control others. May the Spirit give us the courage to make the personal changes that will bring harmony. Let us also pray for patience and wisdom to help us to deal with those people whose unwarranted desire for control causes friction. Finally let us be open to the Spirit so we may begin to see the truth even when it makes us very uncomfortable.




#### BISHOP CHERI GOSPEL MUSIC FESTIVAL
