### **WEEKLY REFLECTION**

When Jesus said "the truth will make you free," he was referring to the truth that he is the redeemer sent from heaven by the Father to bring reconciliation between God and his sinful people. The principle of the liberating power of the truth can be applied in many other situations. We can be entrapped by false perceptions of ourselves and others both positive and negative. The truth empowers us to acknowledge God as the source of all of our blessings and to admit that we are responsible for our evil actions. The truth tells us we can change and that we can have hope in the ultimate victory of good over the power of evil.

We need wisdom from the Holy Spirit to discern the truth. It seems that some people are perpetually optimistic and others are profoundly pessimistic. We recognize that both extremes are inaccurate. We refer to the optimistic as Pollyanna and the pessimistic as Debbie Downers. The first name comes from the 1913 novel *Pollyanna*, and the later comes from a *Saturday Night Live* character. Although blind optimists can be annoying, we tend to have far less tolerance for those who see only the negative.

As we look at the challenges our society faces, it is natural for us to see the all that has gone wrong and everything that threatens the stability of our lives, our families, and our society. Criticism comes easily to us. We can fall into the habit of excessive fault-finding. In some ways, negativity comes naturally to us as humans. Some scholars theorize that we as a species thrive because we are alert to the many dangers that threaten us, so we can take appropriate action in our defense. What helped prevent our ancestors from being eaten by predatory animals can now lead us to non-stop fault-finding and create unnecessary stress in our lives.

Our "negativity bias" can be helpful when evaluating whether someone is trying to take advantage of us. Scammers ae successful when their victims put aside a critical attitude. On the other hand, negativity can poison relationships and diminish trust. We need to question ourselves and ask if we are 100% sure our negative attitude is justified. Does the negative thought make us feel better or worse about ourselves and others? If we are bothered by a negative trait in someone else, let us ask ourselves if we have the same flaw? We should be more compassionate to those who have the same faults we have.

Gratitude is the great tonic for spiritual and emotional health. Let us use the lens of gratitude to look at the negative in ourselves, in others, and in the world around us. Thanking God and thanking those who have been good to us helps us to put the negative in proper perspective. May the Spirit of truth guide us as we confront all that concerns and challenges us.
