WEEKLY REFLECTION

Tuesday, September 12, is the one hundred seventy-fifth anniversary of the death of Fr. Jean Baptiste Maisonaube, S.J., the first superior of the Jesuit mission in New Orleans. He is considered the first pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish and the first head of Jesuit High School. The archbishop of New Orleans asked the superior general of the Society of Jesus to send Jesuits to the city to start a school and to exercise pastoral ministry. Fr. Maisonaube and a handful of other Jesuits from Lyons in France arrived in the United States in 1847. Before coming to New Orleans, Fr. Maisonaube visited Jesuit schools in the northeast to learn how Jesuit education was structured in the United States.

One would expect that Jesuit missionaries from France would face challenges involving different cultures and language. In the eighteen-fifties the Jesuits faced a far greater challenge in their new home. Throughout the forties and fifties, a yellow fever epidemic raged in New Orleans and the surrounding area. The opening of the Jesuits' college had to be delayed for a year and a half because the families of the students left town to avoid contacting the disease. At that time medical science had not determined the source of the illness. Many conjectured that the disease was spread by person to person contact.

The Jesuits ministered to the sick and dying of the city. Maisonaube slept on a cot at the door of the Jesuit residence, so he could be ready to respond quickly to any call to administer the sacraments to the dying. He himself contracted the illness and died on September 12, 1848. Over the next ten years, six other Jesuits died from yellow fever. Many native New Orleanians developed a form of limited immunity to the disease because of their exposure over time. The missionaries from France had no such immunity and like other immigrants were more susceptible to contracting the disease.

The recent pandemic of Covid-19 pales in comparison with the scourge of yellow fever epidemics which lasted from 1796 until 1905. Fr. Maisonaube and his companions did not consider their health and safety to be more important than their priestly responsibility to minister to the faithful. Their eagerness to fulfil their duties in the face of tremendous personal cost provides an example for us. At times, we can become so fixated on our health and safety that we neglect our responsibilities to our families and the various communities to which we belong.

The example of Fr. Maisonaube reminds us to be grateful for those workers whose jobs are necessary for public health and safety. They did not have the luxury of sheltering at home to avoid exposure to Covid-19. Their work could not be done on Zoom. Let us thank the first responders, sanitation workers, hospital personnel, and those involved in the sale and transport of food and other necessities. Let us not forget those who worked for the community at a difficult time in the face of personal risk and sacrifice.

May the Holy Spirit give us a proper perspective on the value our health and safety so that our fears do not inhibit our responding to the call serve to our community.

PARKING at 208 O'Keefe

The parish will provide special codes for parishioners at the previous rate of \$2.00.
