WEEKLY REFLECTION

When speaking to the parents of high school students, I would frequently emphasize the importance of young people developing three qualities that would make a tremendous difference in their lives. Parents and educators need to help youth develop resilience, a sense of purpose, and a moral compass.

In my first talk with parents of incoming students, I would guarantee them that their sons would experience frustration, disappointment, and defeat during their high school years. No one can be perfectly successful in facing every challenge in his life. The more one expects of oneself, the more one will be disappointed. Resilience protects us from allowing discouragement to inhibit our response to challenges. When we teach children to be resilient in the face of difficulties, we help them avoid unhealthy and unproductive reactions to difficulties. I encouraged parents to avoid using what I called the "D word" – devastation. All too often we fall into using "devastation" when we simply should say "disappointed." Exaggerating the negative is never helpful.

Our efforts to develop resilience meet two major obstacles: self-pity and our reluctance to surrender our comfort. Failure is uncomfortable and disconcerting. We can be tempted move away from challenges lest our efforts fail again. We can nurture all sorts of irrational thoughts about our value as a person. We can catastrophize our disappointment. In doing so we reinforce our desire to remain comfortable by giving up. Resilience involves our fighting against feelings of discouragement.

Self-pity has a corrosive effect on our spirit. It weakens us and convinces us the challenge is not worth our effort. Self-pity is the choice to be powerless. Feeling sorry for ourselves and blaming others helps us to excuse our mistakes, but it does not help us attain our goals. Developing resilience is a life-long struggle against the forces that want us to remain powerless and inert.

Without resilience we cannot develop a moral compass. Doing the right thing can be frustrating and involve sacrifice. Likewise, it can be hard to develop a sense of purpose when we allow frustrations to lead us into withdrawal and apathy.

Let us pray for greater resilience in our lives so we can provide example and encouragement for others who may be tempted to surrender when frustrated.

PARKING at 208 O'Keefe

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment. Instead of using pre-paid cards, you will enter a one-time code on the Premium Parking app. Details are available on the website www.jesuitchurch.net and on the parish Facebook page Immaculate Conception Jesuit Church. You may bring to church office the cards you previously purchased, and we will give you a list of the one-time access codes. You may come to the church office Monday to Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Upon entering the garage, please enter the six-digit code and your license plate number in the Premium Parking app. You may park for 120 minutes.

The parish will provide special codes for parishioners at the previous rate of \$2.00.
