WEEKLY REFLECTION

An unusual question has recently appeared all over social media. "How often do you think about the Roman Empire?" When I prepare a homily, I have to think about the Romans. Jesus lived under the domination of imperial Rome. The Holy Spirit inspired the New Testament writers in the century after Jesus' execution by the Roman army. To understand the meaning of the New Testament, one must understand how Roman culture and Roman domination affected the Church of the first century. The Book of Revelation encouraged Christians to struggle against the power of evil and to remain faithful in the face of persecution by the beast, the Roman Empire. The number 666 was a code for the Emperor Nero, who was probably the worst of the blood-thirsty imperial degenerates.

The empire fell in 476, long after Roman society had begun a downward spiral into decadence. Before emperors concentrated all power in their hands, the Romans prided themselves on their republican virtues, which included mercy, dignity, tenancy, frugalness, dutifulness, prudence, responsibility, industriousness, and truthfulness. The long decline of the empire promoted a culture in which the opposite values dominated society.

Will the United States fall into the same pattern of decline? One cannot fail to notice that there are many parallels. As decline set in, the Roman Empire spent enormous sums of money on war, increased the debt, and inflated the currency. Bread and circuses helped to tranquilize an angry unemployed populace that congregated in the cities after losing their farm land to the owners of enormous estates.

The founding generation of the American republic admired the virtues of the ancient Roman republic. It seems that much of our culture no longer values dignity, frugality, duty, personal responsibility, hard work, and truth. Self-indulgence, anger, envy, entitlement, and indolence characterize much of our society.

Many of our leaders have failed us. Many no longer trust the institutions that were previously well-respected and provided a unifying force for the culture. This weekly reflection begins a series on the decline of trust in the church, the family, the news media, academia, technology, and the government and our political leadership.

What we relied upon in the past is no longer reliable. Let us turn to our Creator who is eager to heal and uplift the downcast. "Do not put your trust in princes, in mortal men, who cannot save." (Psalm 146:3) Let us pray for the encouragement we need in the daily struggle with the forces of evil that promote self-indulgence, anger, envy, entitlement, and indolence.

PARKING at 208 O'Keefe

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment. You may bring to church office the cards you previously purchased, and we will give you a list of the one-time access codes. You may come to the church office Monday to Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Upon entering the garage, please enter the six-digit code and your license plate number in the Premium Parking app. You may park for 120 minutes.

The parish will provide special codes for parishioners at the previous rate of \$2.00.
