WEEKLY REFLECTION

Confidence in many of the major institutions of American public life has been declining for many years. Fewer people have faith in the news media, the church, labor unions, and large corporations. Nowhere is the decline in respect more evident than in the very strong public disapproval of all branches and levels of government. The common perception is that few of our leaders promote reconciliation and compromise. Division and acrimony appear at all levels.

The Latin phrase *e pluribus unum* appears on the Great Seal of the United States. Our national goal has been to create one nation out of many, yet the forces of division and hostility seem to supersede the spirt of unity and harmony. The founding generation developed a republic based on compromise. Many of the checks and balances in the Constitution emerged from compromises between groups with strongly held opinions about the structure of the new government. Today openness to compromise appears to be very rare.

I suggest the rigidity of political positions and the inability to find common ground results from a mindset that has become common throughout our society. "All or nothing thinking" distorts our perception of the world and leads people into unnecessary depression, anxiety, and anger. When we tell ourselves that we are complete failures (rather than someone who makes mistakes and needs to grow), we allow depression and discouragement to control our lives. When we exaggerate our fears instead of making appropriate preparations, we fall into unnecessary anxiety. Similarly, when we insist that the other side of the argument has no basis in truth whatsoever, we cut ourselves off from any possibility of a mutually satisfying resolution to the conflict.

It is impossible to make progress if each side view the other as totally wrong. But it can get worse. Some partisans insist that their opponents are not only mistaken they are evil. Distorted thinking causes a mindless descent into intolerance. "All or nothing thinking" distorts the truth, exaggerates our virtue, and diminishes respect for those who disagree. The whole nation needs cognitive therapy. Instead of virtue signaling, we should admit that there may be undesirable unforeseen consequences of our good intentions. Those who disagree with our good intentions are not evil; they may see a part of the truth to which we are blind. No one wins when we insist we have a monopoly on the truth and when we refuse to respect views that differ from our own.

Let us pray for a spirit of humility in ourselves and our leaders. May the Holy Spirit give us the courage to defend the truth while trying to understand those who disagree with us. May we nurture unity and harmony as we courageously battle the spirit of anger and division.

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment. You may bring to church office the cards you previously purchased, and we will give you a list of the one-time access codes. You may come to the church office Monday to Friday 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Upon entering the garage, please enter the six-digit code and your license plate number in the Premium Parking app. You may park for 120 minutes.

The parish will provide special codes for parishioners at the previous rate of \$2.00.
