WEEKLY REFLECTION Pleasure without conscience

In 1925 Mohandas Gandhi published an article that enumerated seven deadly social sins, wealth without work, pleasure without conscience, knowledge without character, commerce without morality, science without humanity, worship without sacrifice, and politics without principle. This series of weekly reflections will comment on Gandhi's perspective on human failings.

Gandhi believed that pleasure should come from within. We should find our excitement in serving the needy and caring for our children and family. We should seek spiritual pleasure rather than indulge in physical pleasures which can lead to lives of pleasure without conscience.

Our conscience provides healthy boundaries for us as we proceed through life. God created us with healthy desires that are intended to motivate us to live in accord with his plan for humanity. Our appetite for food encourages to eat. Our survival depends on the nourishment we receive from food which gives us pleasure. Conscience provides a boundary for us. The excessive indulgence in food and drink leads to great unhappiness and suffering for oneself and for others. God created human persons as sexual beings with a desire for appropriate intimacy. Without that desire the human race would soon disappear. Unfortunately, we can abuse God's gift of pleasure when we do not stay within the boundaries set for us by the law of nature.

Pleasure without conscience can descend into the unlimited satisfaction of desires without regard to our health or to health and wellbeing of others. The person who habitually uses illegal drugs or drinks alcohol to excess chooses on the basis on what gives him pleasure without regard to reasonable boundaries. Addictive behaviors can start when a person repeatedly seeks pleasure or excitement without considering the long-term effects of his choices.

Let us pray for those struggling with addictions, may the grace of God strengthen their resolve to make healthy choices. May we be more supportive of friends and relatives facing the temptation of choosing pleasure without boundaries or conscience.

The church's high altar was designed by architect James Freret, who was one of the first two graduates of Jesuit High School. The altar was built in Lyons, France, and dedicated on December 8, 1873, 150 years ago. The first Jesuits in New Orleans emigrated from Lyons in 1847.
