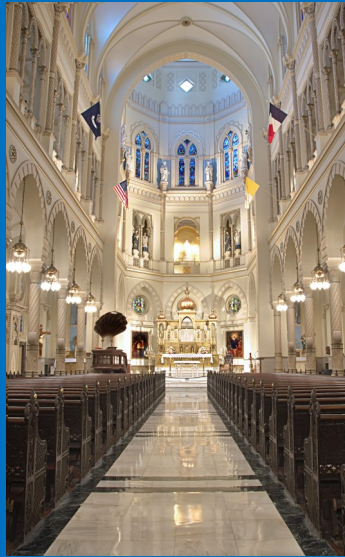

WEEKLY REFLECTION
Fathers' Day

In the past twenty-five years, many questionable concepts have gained widespread acceptance. Some of these ideas are based on distorted views of human nature and society. I can appreciate the feelings of one prominent figure who once quipped, "We are on the fast train to Crazyville."

The notion that fathers are optional runs counter to the collective human experience through all cultures and over many millennia. Only recently have some activists begun to defend the desirability of families without fathers. Unfortunately, there are circumstances where families have to adapt to the loss of the father. Many single mothers lead heroic lives as they do their best, standing alone, in the struggle to fulfil the roles of two parents. They deserve our support and encouragement.

Every father has the responsibility to act as a moral guide who provides structure and protection. He has the burden of shaping the next generation. Rules and discipline are enforced to help children grow in the realization that their decisions have consequences. Children need boundaries established and enforced in love so they can develop into competent and well-adjusted adults. Fathers provide example for their children. Fatherhood represents meaning through sacrifice, strength through responsibility, and love through moral leadership.

Academic studies have shown the significant advantages of growing up in a family with a father present. Children with actively involved fathers tend to have higher self-esteem and are better able to regulate their emotions. They are less likely to engage in risky behaviors as adolescents. A nurturing father helps children better understand and manage their emotions. Adults who had involved fathers tend to have lower rates of depression, anxiety, and other mental disorders.

There is evidence that children with present fathers develop stronger social skills and healthier peer relationships. They are less likely to be involved in juvenile delinquency or criminal activity in adulthood. Active fathers enable their children to develop cooperation, empathy, and conflict resolution.

Let us express our gratitude to our fathers. Let us also resolve to help young men as they assume the role of fatherhood. Let us pray for our families and for our society that they may better reflect the values of God's Kingdom.

PARKING at 208 O'Keefe

The new management of the parking garage at 208 O'Keefe has installed a new system for payment. Instead of using pre-paid cards, you will enter a one-time code on the Premium Parking app. Details are available on the website www.jesuitchurch.net and on the parish Facebook page *Immaculate Conception Jesuit Church*.

Upon entering the garage, please enter the six-digit code and your license plate number in the Premium Parking app. You may park for 120 minutes.
