



Once again, St. Mary School will be collecting Acme receipts. Please help us reach our goal of \$500.00. We will be collecting them until Christmas. Thank you for your support!


DIOCESE OF CLEVELAND HURRICANE IDA COLLECTION

ST. MATTHEW THE APOSTLE


Feast Day: September 21 • Patron Saint of Accountants, Bankers

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MARATHON DAY COFFEE SALE



THE CATECHESIS CORNER (CCC 786)

"We are a Royal People"

786: Finally, the People of God share in the royal office of Christ. He exercises his kingship by drawing all men to himself through his death and Resurrection. Christ, King and Lord of the universe, made himself the servant of all, for he came "not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." For the Christian, "to reign is to serve him," particularly when serving "the poor and the suffering, in whom the Church recognizes the image of her poor and suffering founder." The People of God fulfills its royal dignity by a life in keeping with its vocation to serve with Christ.

The sign of the cross makes kings of all those reborn in Christ and the anointing of the Holy Spirit consecrates them as priests, so that, apart from the particular service of our ministry, all spiritual and rational Christians are recognized as members of this royal race and sharers in Christ's priestly office. What, indeed, is as royal for a soul as to govern the body in obedience to God? And what is as priestly as to dedicate a pure conscience to the Lord and to offer the spotless offerings of devotion on the altar of the heart?

PASTOR'S NOTE

For many, this time of year represents a changing of gears and focus from summer fun to work, routine and mission. It can be dreaded and mourned. (Our Lady of Sorrows, Pray For Us!) But it is usually done in order to live a great life! Today's Gospel, backed up by the Catechism of the week! reminds us that to do the most great things means to serve truly after the example of Christ and at His command. We are mindful that such service can come in many ways: through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy; through little acts that no one else sees; through the career choices to serve that we make perhaps by going into government work or perhaps by leaving work to have more family service and quality time; or even through large and ultimate sacrifices such as the ones our safety forces, care professionals and military provide for us daily. I hope we will be able to have another review of what all is going on and offer each the chance to participate. But as Church, we are asked to always be serving as Christ in this royal and very rewarding way wherever we are. In that way, what we do when we are at church prepares us and strengthens us for what we are to be doing as Church when we are not at church.

May God grant blessing and success to your endeavors and plans! If your aim is to serve and be a person of service, God certainly will!


