

Welcome, New Catholics!



The Crusaders Corner by Deborah Sesek St. Mary School Enrichment Center



The St. Mary School Enrichment Center offers students an opportunity for a one-on-one learning experience after school on Thursdays. Adult, college, and high school volunteers work with students on homework and basic skills such as math, reading and writing. The purpose of the after-school Enrichment Program is to help St. Mary students be successful academically, encourage them to learn and study, and provide positive reinforcement and role models.



From its beginning in 2017, the after-school Enrichment Program has been open to all St. Mary School students in grades one through eight. The number of St. Mary students participating in the program has grown from about 70 in the 2017-2018 school year to over 100 students during this current 2022-2023 school year. There is no cost to the students who are provided all necessary



learning materials and an after-school snack.



The Enrichment Program is possible because of the support of the St. Mary School administration and faculty and the participation of many volunteers. Teachers provide instructions and worksheets to assist and guide volunteers. Most volunteers have no educational experience or training but are people of goodwill who want to help a child succeed. Volunteers come from all over Summit County and identify as members of 22 different parishes, including St. Bernard. Students and Volunteers work together for one hour from 3:15 to 4:15 p.m. on most Thursdays from September to May.

The St. Mary School Enrichment Program is working on many levels. Students benefit both academically and personally from the individual attention and encouragement provided by volunteers. The volunteers in turn learn about the challenges and potential of inner-city children caught in the life cycle of generational poverty. Relationships are being developed and all involved are learning from one another. Through education we hopefully make a difference in the lives of our students and our community.




