## A Word from Father Chris

The two "words" are more phrases: "Vote No Because..." and "Welcome Latin Mass!"



According to a former Federal Prosecutor's analysis of the application of the amendment that was recently published in St. Hilary's bulletin, there are at least five reasons to vote No to Issue 1 on November 7<sup>th</sup>: In the application of the amendment, meaning its actual function and enforcement if passed, the language of the amendment: allows courts to create additional, unspecified and unvoted upon rights and decisions regarding abortion, contraception and fertility treatment; allows

for parents to be uninformed of their children's decisions regarding their gender or sexuality; permits and legally protects late-term partial birth abortion; allows for those who assist a child or a sex worker in getting an abortion to not be prosecuted, including human traffickers and adult abusers; promotes a culture of rejection and termination versus a culture that promotes and defends human life. If you can vote, please go to the polls and vote NO on Issue 1 on November 7<sup>th</sup> because lives are at stake! For more info, visit:

We will try hard as a people of St. Mary to be as welcoming and accommodating as possible and we look forward to the ways in which this beautiful celebration and liturgical expression will bring life to our parish! What are the words the Lord is saying to you and through you and your actions at this time of year? Actions speak louder than words! But these are my three for now. God Bless You!







## Marathon Team Prays at 6:00 a.m., Brings Home 49th!




Team Beauty and the Beasts (sounds like a good name for a band!) set out to run as a relay team at the annual Akron Marathon on Saturday, September 30!




