A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC

Dear Faith Family,

As the days of Advent come to a close and the fullness of Christmas Joy is realized, I want to express my gratitude for your heartfelt cards and gifts. It is most humbling. This year as an act of thanksgiving, I have donated the funds that I would have spent on cards and mailing to charities near and dear to my heart: Catholic Schools and Pro-life services. May God bless you in the coming Christmas Season.

On Christmas Eve and Day each year, the one collection authorized in the parishes of the Archdiocese of Boston is to support the retirement and health needs of the priests of the Archdiocese. In recent years these funds have been depleted by the growing needs of an aging cohort of priests. The stress of attempting to maintain services and presence with less priests has also taken a toll on the health of priests. I ask you to please be generous in your giving. Also, if you have the inclination to write an account of a positive interaction with a priest of the Archdiocese, I would happily receive them. You can mail them to the office or put them in the collection basket. I hope to give a copy of your accounts to Cardinal O'Malley. I am most grateful to the priests that have served me and my family. I remember them by name and each day I attempt to live up to their example - that is my Dream, ever mindful of the need of correction and repentance to actualize that dream.

Here's one of my reflections: After being ordained for a few years, I visited my home parish of Theresa in Billerica with my family. After Mass I greeted my nephew at the side door of the Church. With tongue in cheek, I asked this five year old: "Who is your favorite priest?" He looked me right in the eyes and without hesitation said: "Fr. Jack!" Well, needless to say that burst my bubble. I was ready for him to say that I was his favorite priest and I would respond: "Jesus is the favorite priest and only priest." Well, Fr. Jack was my favorite priest growing-up in St. Theresa Parish as well. I hope you have a favorite priest and can prayerfully honor him with an anecdote of why.

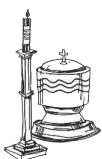

SAINT AGNES MUSIC NOTES

Our Offertory Hymn this week is "*Gabriel's Message*", or "*The angel Gabriel from heaven came*". It is a Basque Christmas folk carol about the Annunciation to the Virgin Mary by the archangel Gabriel that she would become the mother of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It quotes the biblical account of that event (Luke, Chapter 1, verses 26-38) and Mary's Magnificat (Luke 1.46-55). This Basque folk carol, originally based on *Angelus Ad Virginem*, a 13th or 14th Century Latin carol, was translated into English by Sabine Baring-Gould, who had spent a winter as a boy in the Basque country. *Gabriel's Message* has an unusual meter of alternating 9/8 and 12/8. This rhythmical meter of 'long-short' gives it a rolling quality that appears to push it along as we sing. It is most easily recognized by the lilting refrain, "Most highly favored Lady!" Gloria!

We continue to sing the Chant Mass for the sung portions of our liturgy this Advent. It is found in the order of worship in the front of Breaking Bread. We also sing the hymn, *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*, as a recessional hymn at the end of Mass throughout the advent season. Today we sing the first and final verse of this hymn as we prepare for the coming of the Messiah!

REMEMBER THE POOR

THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION, PART II

Every year it gets me. These are the days when I think of what it must have been like for St. Joseph and the Virgin Mary to leave Nazareth. Can you imagine how difficult it was for the holy couple to leave their home? Just think of this very pregnant woman traveling. Who knows whether it was on a donkey or on foot. Perhaps it was a five-day journey. Think of the privations and the sufferings along the way. Then, the final challenge: their arrival as unwelcomed, homeless migrants. I would like to think that the poverty of Mary prepared her to receive the source of all riches, her divine child.

In my previous column, I wrote about Our Lady. She is without sin and full of grace. Today, since the gospel speaks of her conceiving through the Holy Spirit, let's consider the poverty of the Virgin Mary.

First, we consider her material poverty. It was certainly a negative thing for them to not have what they needed along the way. To finish their journey and then find no place for them in the inn was sad, but strangely fitting. St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother are the perfect intercessors for those who endure economic injustices. The lack of hospitality they received in Bethlehem shows us negative material poverty. But, there was a positive side. Since they both chose married virginity, it is not too much of a stretch to consider them as joyfully choosing their poverty. That sounds like positive material poverty.

Now, the spiritual side. The empty hands of Mary's material poverty helps her to have the open arms of spiritual poverty. The



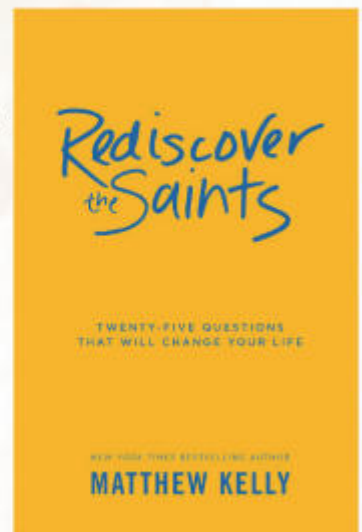
only thing she had was the Lord, as his lowly handmaid. Now, since she was without sin, there's no way of considering her as ever demonstrating negative spiritual poverty, the poverty of sinfulness. But that's where we come in. We always pray to her in the Hail Mary: pray for us sinners.

So, if you find yourself in traffic this Christmas season, just say a prayer to the Virgin Mary asking for patience. It is also an opportunity for us to pray for those trapped in negative aspects of poverty and to pray that more of us embrace the positive forms of poverty.

You have no idea what you are capable of...

God is constantly trying to open our eyes to the amazing possibilities that he has enfolded in our being. The saints continue this work, encouraging us to explore all our God-given potential

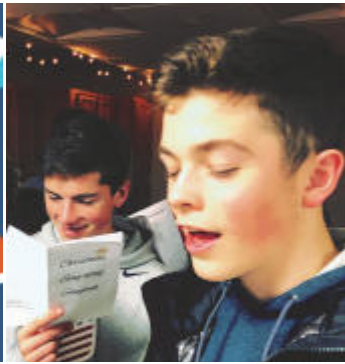

FOUNDATION TRUST'S REGIONAL PAROCHIAL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM EXPANDS

The Foundation Trust, a private operating foundation serving Greater Boston, is pleased to announce the second year of the *Foundation Trust Regional Parochial School Scholarship Program* to provide financial need or family adversity-based scholarships to offset tuition costs for parochial high school students. The trustees of the Foundation Trust established this scholarship to mitigate the financial burden of unanticipated adversity on a family's ability to continue their child's parochial education.

In its first year, the *Foundation Trust Regional Parochial School Scholarship Program* supported selected students from St. Mary of the Annunciation School in Melrose. For the 2019-2020 academic year, the Foundation Trust is expanding the geographic reach of its scholarship program by additionally supporting three students from Arlington Catholic High School. In total, six students received scholarship support for this school year, covering either half or full tuition.

Foundation Trust Executive Director and Trustee, Dr. Joseph Spinazzola, remarked "after a successful first year of scholarship support at St. Mary's in Melrose, this year marks the first Foundation Trust scholarships awarded to students at Arlington Catholic High School. We are pleased that this new partnership was able to identify and support three outstanding students whose parochial education was at risk due to challenging life and financial circumstances. The Foundation Trust is humbled to assist these families in their times of need."

Sophia Bost is a sophomore this year at Arlington Catholic High School. Sophia keeps busy with soccer and basketball, and is in almost all honors classes in school. Her drive as a student and athlete are particularly admirable, given the challenges she has faced over the last year.

Sophia's father unexpectedly passed away last Thanksgiving. Sophia's mother, Christine Simone, noted that "it was a particularly hard time to lose her father. Now she has to deal not only with the stress of being a teenager, but also with her grief."

However, as her mother said "Sophia is an extremely resilient kid." Even immediately after her loss, she wanted to go back to school, and she did not miss school or practices. The Arlington Catholic community rallied around Sophia, with students, teachers, and coaches reaching out with their support. "The school has been so supportive. It has been the place she needed to be, in spite of all she's going through. She feels so supported there. She can keep herself engaged there and not have to always dwell on her loss," shared her mother.

Keeping Sophia at Arlington Catholic for the next year was a priority for the family. "It would be devastating for Sophia to have to leave the school. You don't realize the contribution of the other parent until they're gone. The scholarship from the Foundation Trust makes a huge difference."

Olivia Copeland is in her senior year at Arlington Catholic High School. She is currently busy with college applications and enjoying her final year at a school that feels like home, with friends and teachers who feel like family.

Olivia's path has not been easy. In spite of the adversity she has faced due to a close family member's mental illness, Olivia does very well at school, repeatedly appearing on the school's honor roll. "I like to say she's a smart cookie," says Maureen Romanik, who was foster parent to Olivia and who remains a critical figure in Olivia's life.

Arlington Catholic High School has been an outstanding, supportive community that has helped her thrive. When she was younger, she found large class sizes overwhelming, so the smaller classes at Arlington Catholic were a big draw. "She has benefited so greatly from going to school there. They really look at each child and do whatever they can to make them successful," says Maureen. "There was no way she was not going to attend Arlington Catholic for her senior year; we would have found a way to make it happen. But the scholarship from the Foundation Trust helped immensely, and we are so grateful that burden has been lifted."

Maureen concluded that "she's one of those kids that's determined to be a survivor. There is such strength and goodness in her. She accepts opportunities in life and keeps moving forward. I just know Olivia's destined to do something wonderful."

Nico Russo is a sophomore at Arlington Catholic High School. Like the other recipients of this year's scholarship, he noted that the school "just feels like home."

When he was twelve years old, Nico's father was in an accident that left him disabled and in need of extended care at a group home. In spite of his family's hardship, Nico remains an engaged student at Arlington Catholic High School. "He's a great student, a great kid. I never had to worry about him keeping up with school work. Nico is an excellent writer, too," shared Annetta Russo, Nico's mother.

Nico's favorite subjects in school are Chemistry and History. He is currently taking Honors World History, where he is enjoying learning about the French Revolution. Outside of school, hockey is his passion, where he plays defense. "I'm not sure yet what I want to do after high school," commented Nico, "but it will probably include hockey!" interjects Annetta.

"The scholarship has been a blessing, it was crazy to find out I got it," shared Nico. Annetta added that "we were really taken back. It has made a world of difference at a time when things were really rough and money was tight. We are so grateful."

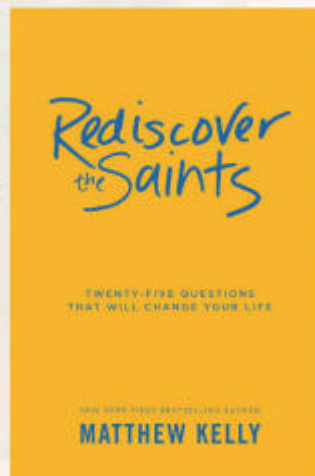

CHANGING THE WORLD (Part 5)

Note: This is the fifth in a series of five bulletin articles that share information on the foundational principles of the Dynamic Parish Initiative from Matthew Kelly's book "The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic." The five-year initiative will invite all parishioners to adopt the four life-giving habits (signs) of a Dynamic Catholic: Prayer, Study, Generosity and Evangelization.

How is the best way to live?

Every great civilization has concerned itself with this question: How is the best way to live? The rigor with which a person or culture approaches this question is very telling. It is of disturbing importance to note that the present culture has virtually no interest in pursuing this question. Today we are more interested in how we want to live than we are in discovering the best way to live. In our quest to discover the best way to live, we discover three universal principles:

- The First Principle: You are here to become the-best-version-of-yourself.
- The Second Principle: Virtue is the ultimate organizing principle, whether it is in a person's life, one's marriage, or the life of a nation.
- The Third Principle: It is better to live with self-control than without it.

Evangelization = Changing the World for the Better

The world is the way it is today because of human behavior. The world is constantly changing, for better or for worse. What makes it better or worse tomorrow? The way we live our lives today. Imagine all of the misery that could be avoided if we all just lived by the life-giving wisdom found in the Ten Commandments. Think for a moment on all the suffering that is caused because humanity has been unwilling to adopt a pattern of behavior and a social structure that celebrates the wisdom of the Ten.

Jesus's answer to how the best way to live was, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind . . . and love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 26:37-39) God wants to **win** you with his love and wisdom; God wants to **build** you up spiritually so that you have the knowledge and habits to live in his love and walk in his ways; and God wants to **send** you out into the world to share his love with others. Win. Build. Send. There are three common ways people are won: through truth, beauty, and goodness.

What led you to become more intentional in the way you live your Catholic faith?

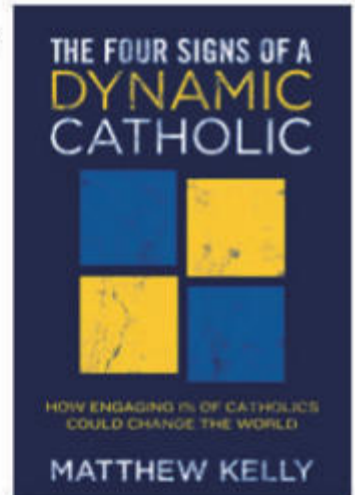
Among the Dynamic Catholics who were interviewed as part of this research, 89 percent described a conversion experience—an event in their life that won them to a more engaged relationship with God. God wants to build in you a dynamic spirituality. He wants our parishes to help people of all ages build a spiritual life so that through our regular spiritual routines he can build and refine us in his image. It is not enough for us to hope that this happens. We need process and intentionality. These are two of the key ingredients of effective evangelization. It isn't just going to happen.

We need a plan. Friendship is the most natural and effective way to share the faith with others. People don't fail because they want to fail. They fail because they don't know how to succeed. Throughout the Win and Build stages, one of the things that happens to people is that they start to feel good about being Catholic. We don't talk anywhere near enough about this. In the context of a theological discussion or Church governance this might seem a little soft, but it is absolutely essential to the life and growth of the Church. Dynamic Catholics feel good about being Catholic. They are inspired Catholics.

Dynamic Catholics choose many simple ways to evangelize. They share books. They like or share social media messages. They invite people to Catholic events and gatherings. They bring a godly perspective to conversations. They learn the Catholic teachings on certain issues and are able to articulate them when the Church is attacked over those issues in social settings. They help people discover answers to the questions that cause them to doubt the Catholic faith. Importantly, they strive to demonstrate the love of God through faithful and generous friendship. Evangelization is to the Church what breathing is to a person.

ACTION STEP:

Try to do one (additional) thing each week to share the faith with someone who crosses your path.

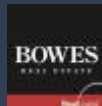
