Dear Faith Family,

This weekend at the St. Agnes 9:00 AM Mass we are Commissioning the St. Agnes Parish 8th Graders as they complete Religious Education and move into the Collaborative Confirmation Program. This Commissioning Mass is a time to celebrate the commitment of the

students and the catechists. A special thanks is due to Marv Lou Vest, the St. Agnes Coordinator of Religious Education, who gives of her time and talent to serve our youth. Thank you Mary Lou.

With special interest to our St. Camillus Parish members, we have entered into a contract with Algonquin Gas Company to lease the Dow Street Parking Lot for the next year with a possibility to extend to two years. This lease is instrumental in our being able to meet the financial needs of St. Camillus Parish. You will see new fencing that will maintain security and safety for the employees and the people in the neighborhood. The Town of Arlington will still have access to the rear of the lot to dump snow.

It is all our responsibility to insure a healthy worship environment. If you are unwell, you are encouraged to stay home. We are taking several precautions: the water fonts have been emptied and cleaned; the Precious Blood is reserved for those with a gluten sensitivity that prevents them from receiving the Host; the Sign-of-Peace is either omitted or non-touching; and the Church is frequently cleaned. Please, help us make our Churches a safe and healthy environment for all who attend.

This week the Catholic Appeal is being announced. The collection will be held next weekend. Next week envelopes will be available in the pews. 


RICE BOWLS

SAINT AGNES MUSIC NOTES

Here at St. Agnes, you will recognize that our liturgical celebrations will take on a different character in Lent. You'll notice the music will be very reflective in nature, with a more introspective character. Many of the Lenten pieces are written in a minor key, Liturgy and Music with a quieter sound, often felt as more prayerful and penitential. We will be using

the Chant Mass for the settings of the Holy, Holy, Memorial Acclamation number 12, "Save us, Savior of the world", Amen and Lamb of God. These settings are found in the order of the Mass at the beginning of the Breaking Bread Hymnal.

As we did last year, we will sing the Marian Antiphon, Ave Regina caelórum, as our closing hymn. This hymn to Mary, one of four Marian Antiphons, is the one historically sung in Lent.

It is a prayerful hymn to the Blessed Mother asking her to intercede for us to Christ our Lord. The hymn is sung in Latin. I know that many of you have said that you haven't studied Latin--and neither have I. That being said, both Fr. Marc and I believe it to be an important part of our Catholic heritage and a beautiful prayer for the Lenten season. Its pronunciation is really quite simple and there are only 8 lines. I have included a phonetic rendering in the bulletin (page 4) along with the written music. The phonetic rendering looks rather odd, but if you try to pronounce it, you'll find it reads along rather easily.

These changes in Mass Settings and hymns will create a quieter and perhaps noticeably more prayerful atmosphere in our corporate worship. I pray that these changes will aid in your personal Lenten journey.

In my faith and in my life I try to show the best version of myself and have been told by others that they are able to see the change. Each day, as Matthew says, I spend time in silence and pray. I have developed a

great love and connection with the Holy Spirit. When I go out on my run each morning, I really feel that I am with the Holy Spirit.


Growing up, I was always told I couldn't do things. I lost my Dad in 1981 and have been trying hard to overcome my learning differences. With the support and coaching of our parish priests and staff teaching me about being a dynamic Catholic, along with the books, that I can live what is in the books and be the best version of myself. I use this strength to coach the kids I work with by telling them to put forth the best version of themselves. I see that the kids are now happier and working hard.

I will be doing the Best Lent Ever and my life and faith will still be getting stronger. I will watch the video each morning and then go out and run and reflect on it.

Once again, I want to especially thank Fr. Marc, Fr. Michael, and Scott Morin for teaching me and helping me to be a dynamic Catholic, along with Matthew Kelly, for changing my life.



BUILD A BED ON GOOD FRIDAY!

A good night's sleep has a major effect on a child's ability to come to school prepared to learn; falling behind due to a lack of sleep can have negative long term consequences on a

student's education and future. A proven pathway out of homelessness is to ensure children of low-income families receive an education that will allow them to graduate from high school. To do this, we have to give these children the tools they need to succeed. One of these tools is a bed. The Massachusetts Coalition for the Homeless partners with public schools to assist students whose families are at risk of becoming homeless. In 2011, their advocates learned that many students in local public schools were not getting a good night's sleep because they did not have their own bed to sleep in at night. The Coalition took action and launched A Bed for Every Child.

REMEMBER THE POOR

Poverty for the Sake of the Gospel

In our reflections over poverty, it is now time to discuss positive material poverty. This poverty is not an injustice against which we all must work. Instead, it is the choice of those guided by the Holy Spirit.

In the Gospel of Mark (10:29-30), Jesus says, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come." This 'giving up things for the sake of the gospel' is the poverty of the monks, nuns, brothers, sisters, friars and all those who have made a religious vow of poverty. These are the people who have committed their hearts to Christ and dedicated all their efforts for the good of the people of God. These are the people who founded and staffed many of our Catholic schools, hospitals, and institutions for years.

I believe, however, the best way to capture the essence of this poverty is to share a story from the lives of the followers of St. Francis. At the beginning of his Order, that is, in the early thirteenth century, St. Francis sent two of his earliest followers, Bernard and Giles on a pilgrimage to the great Spanish shrine of St. James in Compostela. Along the way, the two friars sought shelter for the night by knocking on the door of a house. The lady of the house, in her husband's absence was reluctant both to accept or reject the pilgrims. She, therefore, settled on allowing the friars to pass the frigid night on her front porch. Feeling compassion toward them, she did toss out to the wayfarers some blankets.

The next morning, the woman was eager to see if her guests had respected her property, but they had vanished. At that moment, the husband returned and was furious to learn that his wife had placed his home in such danger. With mixed emotions, the woman made her way to the local church. After the Mass, she was surprised to see the two friars devoutly praying. Just then, a great man of that town, who was accustomed to distribute daily alms to the poor, came upon the pilgrims. As the kind

man offered his money to them, the friars refused saying, "You can keep your money to help others. For us, poverty is a joy, not a burden." The housewife could not contain her remorse. She apologized to the brothers for keeping them out in the cold and begged them to spend that night in her house. The rich man, however, had already prevailed over the travelers.

The privations of the poverty of religious life are a joy for these special souls. They share both the poverty and joy of Christ crucified and glorified.

FAITH IN AN ANXIOUS WORLD: INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

We don't need to look far to see that our teenagers are hurting. While today's parents, stepparents, and ministry leaders are more aware of teen anxiety, and Young Adults depression, and suicide, we often aren't sure how to respond. We need practical,

accessible, and trusted resources that spark vital conversations with our teenagers.

That's why our youth ministry is beginning a new fourweek series called Faith in an Anxious World. In the coming weeks, we want to propel your young person and other students toward a deeper understanding of Christ one in which he becomes to them not simply a teacher and miracle worker, but a living, breathing example of the wholeness we can experience in our daily walk with God. Each week they'll talk about anxiety, delve into stories throughout the Bible where God enters into an anxious situation and uses it to nurture growth, and discover spiritual practices they can use to look to God as they navigate daily life. And each of our gatherings will prompt students to have meaningful conversations beyond their youth meeting times.

As we journey through this four-part series, your student will be encouraged to build themselves a "circle" of trusted adults they can call on when they need to talk about how they feel. Each week your student will receive a take-home sheet that recommends a conversation they can have with a trusted adult. This could be the same adult weekly, or, if your student is comfortable, they can grow a wider circle by connecting with a different trusted adult each time. The wider a student's circle, the more people they will have to turn to in a crisis.

To help you stay sharp as a parent, we are giving you additional tools to help you learn and grow all week long. Keep an eye out for...

- Regular communication from our youth ministry full of suggestions and tools to have life-giving conversations at home with your young person.
- Links to download the Faith in an Anxious World Parenting Podcast featuring parent-focused conversations with mental health experts sharing practical ideas for your family.

Anxiety is a reality for today's teenagers. Let's work together to bring help and hope to an anxious generation!


