A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC

Dear Faith Family,
Each year as we begin Lent I am focused on what I will give up. That is not the purpose of the liturgical season of Lent. The purpose of Lent is to prepare us to celebrate the joy of Easter. The disciplines of Lent are tools to help us prepare for that penultimate day and season.

Lent 2021 feels like a continuation of Lent 2020. This year-long fast has left many of us feeling unsettled.

The holy season of preparation began with the collect of Ash Wednesday:

Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The phrase “campaign of Christian service” strikes me each year. Normally it refocuses me on the need to give alms or my time to the many worthy causes that need our attention. This year the sentiment hit me differently: “How can I be a better witness as one who is campaigning for Christian service? How can I be a better prophet?” Deliberately and sincerely doing God’s will and not acting out of any human agenda or frailty.

This challenge to be a good Christian at all times and with all people is not easy. Over the last year I have read many articles and watched many interviews by people who say they are Christian. They often begin with polite encounters but seldom end there. It occurs



to me that the Christian has to even debate as a Christian. It is not merely enough to be right. One must be holy. The Christian’s argument has to be words of conversion and invitation while “turning the other cheek.” It always shocks me when good people try convincing others of the efficacy of the Gospel by denying its principles: “Judge not lest you be judged”; “treat others as you would have yourself be treated.” Yes, it is harder, much harder. “For what good will it do a person if he gains the whole world, but forfeits his soul?” - Mt 16:26.

“Yet we Christians are very much aware that “if the music of the Gospel ceases to resonate in our very being, we will lose the joy born of compassion, the tender love born of trust, the capacity for reconciliation that has its source in our knowledge that we have been forgiven and sent forth. If the music of the Gospel ceases to sound in our homes, our public squares, our workplaces, our political and financial life, then we will no longer hear the strains that challenge us to defend the dignity of every man and woman (Fratelli Tutti, para. 277).”

Now to struggle in my own “Peniel” (see Genesis 32: 23-33): to be at service to the common good without being caustic; to be a witness to the Hope of our Faith in the Risen Lord.

I pray that your Lenten sojourn is filled with divine encounters of peace and transformation. We have many spiritual tools posted on our website, in our bulletin, and on Facebook page to help you. May the good God lead us to a full celebration of Easter joy.

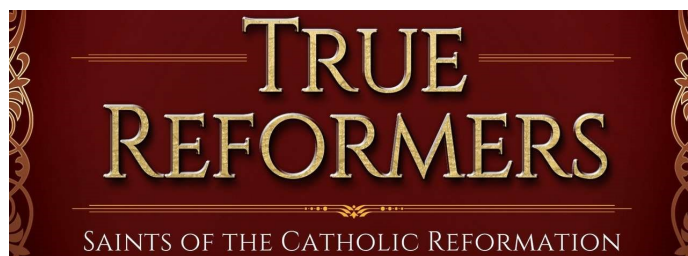

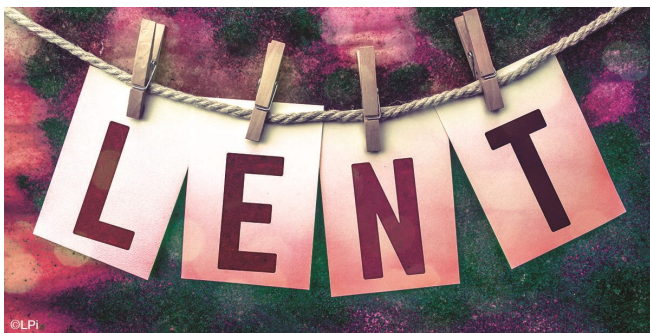

MUSIC NOTES

from Roger

We begin our Lenten journey this week. Liturgically, the Mass will take on a little different feel. We will return to the use of the Chant Mass for the sung portions of the Ordinary. These settings are shorter in time and simpler in musical structure, allowing for a more reflective spirit of prayer. Our hymns and spiritual songs will, of course, be for the season of Lent, and are often inspired by the Scriptures appointed for each week. The songs are typically a bit more introspective and often quieter in nature, and many of these pieces are written in a minor key that some folks may describe as dark or somber. The readings and songs, together with the simpler form of worship and liturgy, provide us the space to reflect on Jesus' journey to the cross, as He bore the weight of the world's sin. It is true that words of joy are not readily seen or heard in Lenten songs, and those emotions are certainly not felt as they would be when we sing "Alleluias" and hymns of Thankfulness and Praise. I would suggest, however, that you listen with the thought of inner prayer and "soul cleansing" as you experience this music and prepare for the joy of the Easter Season. When you look up synonyms for the word cleansing, you find such words as purification, sanctification, forgiveness, atonement and so on. Lent is a time of preparation for us for the Easter Season of joy that is to come. It is a time when we reflect upon how we have lived our lives this past year and what we may have done that we should atone for and improve ourselves and our relationship to God. In other words, Lent is not only about penitence; it



is also about acknowledging God's mercy.

As you may know, we are returning to the reception of the Blessed Sacrament at the usual time during the Mass. There will continue to be a communion antiphon followed by a prayer of spiritual communion, but we will continue with communion hymns and songs appropriate to this solemn moment in our worship as you receive. At the conclusion of the Mass, you will hear the Marian Antiphon prescribed for Lent, *Ave Regina Caelorum*, sung in its original Latin form. The following is the translation of this beautiful Marian prayer, asking Mary to intercede for us to Christ.

Hail, Queen of heaven, hail Lady of the angels.
Hail root and gate from which the Light of the
world was born.
Rejoice glorious Virgin, fairest of all.
Fare thee well, most beautiful, and pray for us to
Christ.

REMEMBER THE POOR SPORTS

As we approach Lent, I want to share one of my favorite scripture passages. It has a special place in our Lenten journey. Within the official prayer book of the Church, the most prominent moment is Sunday Evening Prayer. In the reading within that liturgy for the first four Sundays of Lent, St. Paul says: Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize? Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one. Thus I do not run aimlessly; I do not fight as if I were shadowboxing. No, I drive my body and train it, for fear that, after having preached to others, I myself should be disqualified (1 Corinthians 9:24-27).

Now, you understand the title of this article. I am not planning to defend the best album of Huey Lewis and the News. Instead, I want to share the role of athletics in my vocation story.

Sports taught me humility. The root of this word is similar to our concept of being brought back down to earth. I think of the football games when I fell to the ground after lunging to catch a running back. Many times, I hung my head sitting on the bench because I wasn't good enough to play basketball. I knew the frustration, joy, hard work, and perseverance necessary to lead my youth baseball team to a town championship. Sports helped me to manage life. Not letting my highs get too high and my lows get too low gave birth to humility.

Pain is God's megaphone. This C.S. Lewis quote helped explain a lot in my life. I broke my clavicle just two weeks into my freshman year at college. The Lord used the injury to give me more time to hangout in the Newman Catholic room. Then, my last injury in college made two things clear to

me. First, I should be thankful for my success in college sports. Second, I learned how fragile life is.

Wrestling taught me fasting. I thought to myself: If I can make sacrifices in my diet to make weight, I can definitely deny myself in various ways for love of the Lord.

I know that I am not alone. Sports, like many human activities, provide a setting within which we can grow in positive spiritual poverty.

CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH

VENERABLE PIERRE TOUSSAINT (1766-1853)



Pierre Toussaint was born in June 1766 on the Caribbean island that is now Haiti and the Dominican Republic. His mother was enslaved, thus Pierre became the property of the Bérard family.

By all accounts, the Bérards were more humane than some

slaveowners, and they educated Pierre in the house with other children, teaching him to read and write.

The Bérards returned to France, leaving their eldest son, Jean, in charge of the plantation. In 1787, in the face of mounting unrest that would become the Haitian Revolution, leading to the Islands and its enslaved peoples independence, Jean Bérard and his wife fled to New York City, taking Pierre and his sister Rosalie with them.

Bérard soon returned to Haiti and died. Pierre became the main breadwinner for the household, as he was apprenticed to New York's chief hairdresser. Pierre was allowed to keep his allowance, yet he continued to support the widowed Madame Bérard until she married again. Mrs. Philip Schuyler (mother of the now-famous Schuyler Sisters and mother-in-law of Alexander Hamilton), who wrote an early biography of Pierre, noted his extreme kindness to Madame Bérard. On her deathbed, Madame Bérard's dying wish was for Pierre to be freed.

At the age of forty-five, Pierre was freed and he paid for his sister Rosalie's freedom. In 1811, he

redeemed his young bride, Juliet, from slavery and they were wed. Together, they cared for Pierre's orphaned niece and raised her as their own.

Pierre became a hero of the immigrant Haitian community in New York—he and Juliet provided employment services, lodging, and a credit union for newly freed slaves arriving in the Port of Manhattan. Pierre raised money for the first Catholic school for free black children in New York and for the church that would become the Basilica of Old St. Patrick's Cathedral, which still stands today.

In 1853, Pierre died at the ripe old age of eighty-seven, and his remains were buried in Old St. Patrick's, next to Juliet's. They were later transferred together to the crypt in the new St. Patrick's Cathedral, where they remain today.

In 1996, John Paul II declared Pierre Toussaint Venerable, the first step towards canonization. As a Venerable, Pierre Toussaint does not yet have a feast day, but prayers may be offered, asking for his intercession.

Venerable Pierre Toussaint, who used new-found freedom and hard-earned prosperity to generously serve others—pray for us!

Reflection

Pierre was internally free long before he was legally free. Refusing to become bitter, he daily chose to cooperate with God's grace, eventually becoming a compelling sign of God's wildly generous love.

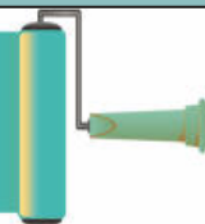
