A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC

Dear Faith Family,
This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. This great celebration marks the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the birthday of the Church. The Psalm Response (104) for this liturgy is "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

God wished to send the Holy Spirit upon His Church today. The graces of Pentecost are constantly being renewed among us and new peoples are called to the life of grace, the life of a disciple of Christ. Over the last nine days, I prayed the Novena of the Holy Spirit for the intention that "the Holy Spirit would raise the hearts of young people to be open to sacramental or consecrated vocation in service to the Church, as priests or religious." I hope that you can make this intention apart of your daily prayers. We need families and parents to pray for vocations and to be open to their child's exploration of a Church vocation.

Every young Catholic should seriously discern whether God is calling them to the priesthood of the consecrated life. If families are open to this exploration of God's call for us, much fruit will come of it. Yes, we will see that young men and young women enter the priesthood or the consecrated life. But we will also see that young Catholics better know their lives are part of God's plan. A plan that no matter what it is, will be happier for being open to a Church vocation. Marriages will be stronger for this type of preparation as well.

Over the last 20 years, I have repeatedly returned to pray with the words of St. John Marie Vianney: "Without the Sacrament of Holy Orders, we would not have the Lord. Who put him there in that tabernacle? The priest. Who welcomed your soul at the beginning of your life? The priest. Who feeds your soul and gives it strength for its journey? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, bathing it one last time in the blood of Jesus Christ?"

The priest, always the priest. And if this soul should happen to die (as a result of sin), who will raise it up, who will restore its calm and peace? Again, the priest... After God, the priest is everything! Only in heaven will he fully realize what he is.

Let us pray that God will call workers for his vineyard and let them know they are supported by our love and prayers.

We especially pray for the young men that will be ordained this weekend by Cardinal Sean at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross: 5 men for Boston and 2 men for the Church in India. All seven will begin their priestly ministry by serving in the parishes of the Archdiocese of Boston. May the good God bless them and those whom they serve.

"Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth."

MUSIC NOTES

from Roger

"Welcome Back" to congregational singing! "Let us make a Joyful Noise to the Lord," even if it is still a bit muffled from under your mask! It's been almost a year since we reopened the church last June when congregational singing was prohibited. Prior to that, we

live-streamed the 12 noon Mass only, and that was with just a priest, a musician and a reader in the church. That all started in March of 2020 as we began our Covid sojourn in our church and in our lives at home and at work. I'm delighted to say that we are returning to many beloved liturgical traditions in our churches in Arlington. Beginning this week, our clergy will process down the full aisle, rather than the short procession from the side. While we don't have all of our servers back and our choir is not yet back in full, there is a great deal of music for you to participate in. This week we have some hymns that are very familiar to you — "Old Chestnuts," as I like to call them. We will return to singing the refrains of the responsorial psalm and Gospel acclamation twice, once by the cantor and the second time by you, the congregation. In addition, we will sing the *Gloria* for this Pentecost Sunday, using a setting of the prayer that will be very familiar to you. For the other sung parts of the Mass, you've been hearing the musical Settings from the *Mass in Honor of Pope Saint John Paul II* for nearly a year; now is time to raise the rafters with song. We may not be quite all of the way back just yet, but there is much to rejoice about!

I have been waiting for some time to be able to use once again one of my most favorite quotes, attributed to Saint Augustine:

"He who sings, prays twice!"

Following are the Latin words and English

translation for the *Regina caeli* Marian Antiphon that we sing at the conclusion of the Mass during this Easter Season, which ends this Pentecost Sunday.

Regina caeli, laetare, alleluia;
Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.

Quia quem meruisti portare, alleluia,
The Son you merited to bear, alleluia,

Resurrexit, sicut dixit, alleluia:
Has risen as he said, alleluia.

Ora pro nobis Deum, alleluia.
Pray to God for us, alleluia.

REMEMBER THE POOR MEETING THE FRIARS

Pentecost Sunday is the day I graduated from college. It is significant that the ceremony is called Commencement. Sure, we completed our time in college, but we were beginning our adult lives.

For me, I was already well on my way toward the ordination to the priesthood because of my relationship with the friars from New Bedford.

As I have mentioned previously, this 'Poor' column is now autobiographical due to feedback from you parishioners. Growing up, I strongly considered becoming a priest. But I thought diocesan priests were not happy because they did not have the love of family life. As a teenager, I did not realize that priests do have love in their lives. It is the love of God that sustains and satisfies priests. I just did not see that from the outside. I needed, therefore, some type of powerful witness to help me choose the seminary. A group of friars here in Massachusetts provided inspiration.

My sophomore year in college, I was very involved in Catholic campus ministry (Newman Catholic). We were very eager to invite priests and speakers for Mass and events. So, you can imagine how happy we were to hear that a group of Franciscan friars was living on a hillside over the border in Vermont. We booked a priest who was a Wall St. bonds salesman before giving it all up for religious life. He agreed to deliver his conversion talk. Flyers, emails, and invites went throughout the campus promoting this "From Riches to Rags" story.

Personally, the dramatic moment was picking him up at the bottom of the hill. Two of us students climbed into the campus minister's car. During the half-hour journey, I wondered what this friar-priest would look like. Some people told us that he and the other friars appeared (and lived) as living statues of St. Francis. I knew what the saint looked like, but I could not imagine that a person living today could actually live that way.

As we approached the parking lot of dirt and stones, there he was. I couldn't believe it. He was a tall man, bald with a long, full beard and coarse gray habit. We met him, welcomed him into the car, and talked as we returned to campus. The conversation was normal enough. But I just could not shake the feeling that we were speaking with a superhero. The other students shared my amazement. The president of Newman Catholic saw the small number of students in the lecture hall, but was pleasantly surprised because of his own low expectations. After the conclusion of the event, however, he said to himself, "Wow, there aren't enough people here. All my classmates should have heard this talk!"

The witness of those friars, the Franciscans of Primitive Observance, was one of positive spiritual poverty and positive material poverty. That way of life rocked my world and convinced me that love for God and happiness was possible in the priesthood.

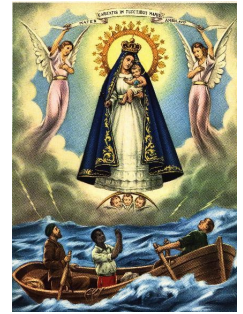
