

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC



Fr. Marc Bishop - Pastor St. Agnes and St. Camillus

Dear Faith Family,

Over the last 18 months, I have grown in my appreciation of sound in the Church. When the pandemic began, I was most often celebrating Mass looking into my iPhone praying that the internet was working.

Frankly, it was quiet and lonely. Over time, we progressed to Masses with muffled responses from too few people (our first Masses were limited to ten people). Then the doors somewhat opened and small but growing groups attended Mass with muffled Responses through facemasks.

With most restrictions lifted people are slowly returning to worshipping in person. We will maintain social distancing on one side of our Churches to help people return comfortably to worship. Some in our community will be coming to Church for the first time or the first time in a long time. Some have reconnected or stayed connected via our livestream. We all need to be open and attentive to who is returning to worship and support them in their return. This is a time when a warm greeting and simply letting people know that you are happy to see them again or for the first time is most appropriate.

Like I said earlier, I have found a new joy in the sounds of a Church at worship. The sounds I like to hear the most are those of families with young children who often populate our pews. We should rejoice in their being there and encourage their parents to bring them to Church. "Let's make a joyful noise unto the Lord." And, I apologize if Mass is at the normal nap time.

As the summer weather arrives, it is also important to be reminded that modest and clean dress in the Church is most respectful. A few years ago, I had a woman come up to me after Mass to complain about the shortness of a young girl's shorts. I hadn't noticed. What I could not help but notice was that the woman in front of me had her blouse unbuttoned beyond the fourth button. Please, be mindful to choose clothing that is modest when attending Church.

Join in the joyful noise by singing the hymns and purposefully participate in the responses. As a presider, the only thing lonelier than celebrating Mass alone is celebrating Mass in a full Church and silence.

As we move into the warmer days of summer, I am reminded that in spite of the pandemic that we have experienced, God's creation of this most beautiful world has continued along on its pathway regardless of all that has happened. We've had snow in the winter, rain

in the spring and now the summer heat is upon us. Thoughts of beach days at the Cape or cooling lakes and streams, or perhaps enjoying the beauty of the mountains are lifting your spirits. Vacation is a time to unwind and reflect on what has passed. It is a time to recharge and re-create ourselves in preparation of new seasons and activities to come. Whether the future tasks are arduous or relaxing, at work or at school, our worship life here in the Catholic Parishes of Arlington is a constant.

We gather each week or in some cases, every day, to pray and receive the nourishment of the Blessed Sacrament. As the Director of Liturgy and Music, I am mindful of my responsibility to provide a prayerful and joyous atmosphere for you in which to pray and meet our Lord. When the pandemic began, we were only able to prepare and present a live stream Mass. When we reopened the church in a limited capacity, we had to remove all of the books and missals from the pews so that folks were not in contact with each other through those books. In its place, we began with a digital worship aid so that folks could follow the readings and the Mass. Recently, now that congregational singing is allowed again, we've added the option of a printed worship aid in hopes that once again we can all raise our voices in sung prayer. The digital worship aid will continue to be available for you as well. Our worship life is truly evolving as we try different approaches to providing you with worship resources. Someone recently asked me why we couldn't simply return to the books that we had been using

pre-pandemic. Many don't realize that all of those materials were discarded at the end of each year, with a renewal that cost the parishes thousands of dollars annually. We will continue to explore new opportunities and methods of providing you with God's word and the Mass.



O pray for the peace of Jerusalem.







Catholic Villages of Arlington Household Church Communities

Catholic Villages of Arlington are a way of being church to each other, not just on Sunday but every day. This is not a new concept - Early Christians met in small groups in each other's homes to share faith and break bread. "Where two or three come together in my name, I am there with them." Matthew 18:20

What are the Catholic Villages of Arlington?

Each Village is a group of 3 to 5 households of varying sizes and make-ups, approximately 20 people (adults, youth, and children) that gather in homes, in the community, or at the parish. Groups gather for Worship, Prayer, Study, Community - also known as the Core Acts.

How often does a Village gather?

Villages gather at least monthly, but are encouraged to gather more frequently.

What about Sacramental Preparation?

Children preparing to celebrate First Reconciliation, First Communion, and/or Confirmation will have a supplemental process for immediate preparation.

What are the Core Acts?

How do Village families live these Core Acts?



SECOND READING SECOND COLUMN **OUR SECOND HOME 2 CORINTHIANS 5: 6-10**

There's no place like home. After time away in the special seasons of Lent and Easter, along with the addition of the recent Solemnity

Sundays, we return to Ordinary Time Sundays. We jump into the midst of the second letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians. By the way, this same letter appears now on ordinary days at Daily Mass. In this section (or pericope) for today, there is a lot of talk of home.

Home is an important concept for so many people. This commonality is the case even if your home has been in many houses. My grandparents, living through the Great Depression, World War II, and the financial insecurities faced by young families moved around a lot. My father, on the other hand, has pretty much lived in the same house his entire life. But we all know how formative the experience of home is.

St. Paul takes this image and applies it to spiritual goals. First, he moves the home imagery from the physical building to the tangible aspect of our human nature: the body. We are indeed home in our bodies. We are our bodies. We have a Composite nature, meaning we consist of our soul and our body. But then he turns our attention to our spiritual end: God. Home here in the body, we are, nonetheless, away from the Lord. We want to be with the Lord. What's the problem? Death. Separation (although temporary estrangement) from the body is the current way to go home to the Lord. Certainly this desirable spiritual goal of heaven is a lofty one, but the passage is terrifying.

The Apostle to the Gentiles offers this solution: courage. He claims we are courageous. While we are away from the Lord, God is actually right with us. He gives us light. By that vision, we walk by faith not by sight. Our mission on this journey of faith is to please the Lord. We seek to do his will in

whatever way possible and wherever possible. It is this strength that helps us to face death. We cross the chasm of between earthly life and heavenly glory by the bridge of courage. We walk that bridge confidently by faith.

This familiarity with the Lord gives us the nerve to approach the judgment seat of Christ at the moment of death. Walking with the Lord helps us to know him. We speak to him. We learn from him. We are comfortable sharing with him and telling others about him. Therefore, we can say that we feel right at home in his presence. This closeness in life passes with us in death. None of our possessions, money, or fame makes this transition. This friendship is our help. It allows us 'to approach the bench' and find a friend. Since our sins also accompany us to the judgment seat of Christ, now in the body we do everything we can to reconcile with the Lord. This reading encourages us to speak to the Lord as a best friend and engage in that spiritual house cleaning known as the sacrament of reconciliation.


