

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC



Fr. Marc Bishop - Pastor St. Agnes and St. Camillus

Dear Faith Family, I would like to thank all that were so very kind to me with prayers and support as I dealt with a COVID-19 positive test. A special thank you to my brother priests who tirelessly ensured that they and the parish were cared for and safe.

Next week we will commemorate the atrocity that is 9/11. Over the last twenty years, we have been living under the shadow of that horrific day. This year's commemorations are certainly poignant not only in marking a twenty-year anniversary but by the recent events and the loss of American lives and those of our supporters in Afghanistan. The events of twenty years ago, the events of the last few weeks, and the numerous events over the entire War on Terror, leave us with many questions and few answers.

Those of us who are Veterans, who have seen what most people cannot even imagine, are particularly affected by this anniversary. We can never forget. We can never forget the smells, sites, and even the taste of war. We have experienced the worst of humanity. That being said we have also experienced the best of humanity: "No greater love than to lay down one's life for a friend." I am alive today because the men I served with were willing to die for me and eleven of them did. I live with that privilege and commission each day.

It horrifies me that on 9/11/2001, those scenes of destruction were experienced on American soil. That there are families and individuals who look out their windows and remember what it looked like. I hope and pray no other generation will ever have to suffer such a memory.

I am grateful that today there are men and women who respond to the call to protect their fellow citizens by serving in the United States Military. They voluntarily take that duty upon themselves so that we can sleep soundly at night knowing we are protected. Our duty is to honor their sacrifices and those of their families. I pray that we do that well.

Jeff Chunglo, the Veterans Agent for Arlington and I, will be holding a new event for Veterans twice this October. Veterans Coffee will be held in the newly renovated St. Agnes Lower Chruch Hall. The first gathering will be on Friday, October 8th at 8:30 AM. The event is open to all Veterans of any era who wish to attend. You can access the lower Church via the handicapped entrance located on the Chestnut Street side of the Church. Coffee and donuts provided. If you know a veteran who might benefit from the gathering, please invite them.



MUSIC NOTES from Roger

I hope that you have enjoyed reading our "Notes from the Loft" articles this summer from The many of our musicians here in the Catholic Parishes of Arlington. I thought it would be a nice opportunity to hear from some of our music makers regarding how they may have

gotten involved in Music Ministry, why they're still involved and what it means to them as Catholics in worship. I found many common thoughts in these articles as I read them each week. The joy of making music, the responsibility of bringing the music to the parish and leading worship, the intimate view that it gives you participating in the Mass, and the opportunity to grow musically and spiritually were among the many similar experiences.

My original thought was also that these articles may bring a more personal view for you that may help to inspire your own involvement in our Music Ministry. We have a long and solid tradition of choir participation. Our choirs have sung tirelessly and beautifully for many Masses and celebrations throughout the years. However, as time marches on, so do some of the choristers through retirement or moving away. There is always room for new singers in our loft at St. Agnes, and in the music area at the front of St. Camillus. I encourage you to consider joining our choir families and getting involved in this most vital ministry. As some of our writers have said, the choir is truly a family sharing its gift of music and spiritual uplifting.

Normally, this would be the time for choir recruitment as we begin a new academic year of ministries around our parishes. This year, there is a slight caveat however. Due to the recent mask mandate from the Arlington Board of Health, Fr. Marc and I have thought it best to delay the start of our full choir season. Singing with a mask is difficult at best for deep breathing, diction, and good tone

production. For me, teaching music through modeling becomes difficult when no one can see my face. In addition, the choir loft is small, making safe social distancing with a full choir quite impossible. Therefore, we are not going to resume in September. We will take this month to monitor how things progress with the pandemic and look ahead to future months. Hopefully October will bring a better understanding of where we are. There are many churches that are following this same path. So for now, please keep singing in your pews, even with a mask. I have been heartened by the singing that I've heard coming up from the congregation.

Choir is returning, but not quite yet! When it does return, I hope you will consider joining us. Stay tuned!

SECOND READING, SECOND COLUMN: PARTY! JAMES 2:1-5

The Sunday of Labor Day Weekend has always been an important date for my family. Beyond being the unofficial end of summer, it was always the most anticipated party of the

year. We gather at Minot Beach for a day packed with activities: beach arts & crafts contest, a costume parade (imagine the funny pictures we have from years past), sprinting races, swimming races, boiled hot dogs & ice cream cups, egg toss, and finally a DJ-led dance at the seawall. As my family has changed over time, this day remains an opportunity for us to reunite and laugh.

All this happy party-talk contrasts with the experience of many with the letter of St. James. It is hard to read this epistle without being challenged in some way. The strong word in today's second reading has to do with prejudice. We read: "Show no partiality." If prejudice is the fruit of a choice to act in a harmful way toward others, then the seed of that choice is partiality, an unjust preference. The author highlights a particular scenario not unknown to his contemporary readers or the rest of Holy Scripture. If by 'assembly' James means 'synagogue,' then this wealth-based distinction seems similar to St. Paul's complaint in 1 Corinthians 11:21 ("for in eating, each one goes ahead with his own supper, and one goes hungry while another gets drunk"). Both writers are speaking of sacred assemblies that deteriorate into separate parties. Thus, this divisive partiality severs Christian communities into factions, contrary "to the faith of our glorious Lord Jesus Christ."

St. James and St. Paul were both eager to remove this cocktail party atmosphere from Christian fellowship. Schmoozing with the rich and despising those who seem not to belong go against our Christian brotherhood and destiny. James focuses on the truth that God chooses the poor in


this world (that is, those suffering from negative material poverty, which I discussed in the 'Remember the Poor' column) to be rich in the things of heaven (i.e., positive spiritual poverty).

As I interpret this final point from St. James, the Holy Spirit guides us to treat everyone in every situation as the Lord desires. Our interactions with all may not look and sound exactly the same. But, the Spirit of the Lord inspires us to speak and act beyond our understanding. For this reason, we pray for the help of the Holy Spirit. In general, however, we keep our minds and hearts open to all people as our spiritual siblings. In this way, we can work in this world so that as many people as possible join us for the eternal party in heaven.

COLLABORATIVE UPDATES

COLLABORATIVE PASTORAL COUNCIL (CPC) OF THE CATHOLIC PARISHES OF ARLINGTON DISCERNMENT PERIOD: SEPT. 5–19

The "CPC" is comprised of 12 (6 from each parish) elected community members, the Parish Clergy, and two staff members. The CPC works with the staff to guide the work and community life of the Collaborative. In addition, one youth member (a person from 14 to 19 years of age, and in High School) will be appointed to the Council. Youth may be nominated as well. Council members will be elected to serve 2-year terms beginning in September 2021.

Elections will be held for six seats (3 from each parish) annually. Terms are renewable twice. The Pastor can appoint members ex officio as is required to best serve the community. The CPC is not a legislative body, it is an essential advisor to the Pastor.

Qualifications

Any registered member of the Parishes may be nominated for consideration. Those nominated should demonstrate the willingness to serve their fellow parishioner by furthering the mission of the Catholic Church. Some thoughts for consideration before nominating or accepting nomination:

- Involvement in one or more of the CPC's ministries or groups
- Desire to contribute to the overall health of the **CPARL Faith Family**
- Enjoy looking at "the big picture"
- Desire to help people connect more deeply with each other and the Church
- Have a real heart for implementing the community's vision in the Pastoral Plan and helping the community determine "what comes next"

Nominated parishioners will be contacted after September 19. The following Sunday, the members will be chosen by lot during a Mass at the corresponding parish, a commissioning prayer service will be held prior to the first meeting on October 3.

He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."


