

# THE COLLABORATIVE PASTORAL COUNCIL DISCERNMENT PERIOD SEPTEMBER 5-19

The Collaborative is a large and multi-faceted community, and the Collaborative Pastoral Council (CPC) is our primary vehicle for "connecting the dots" of the many groups and ministries active in our faith family. The CPC is an essential advisor to the Pastor and works with the staff to guide the efforts and community life of the Collaborative. The CPC is not a legislative body.

The CPC is comprised of 12 (six from St. Camillus and six from St. Agnes) elected community members, the Parish Clergy, two staff members, and one youth member (a person from 14 to 19 years of age, and in High School). Youth may be nominated as well.

#### **Nomination Process**

Parishioners interested in serving in the Pastoral Council are to have their names put into nomination until Sept. 19. The week following the discernment period, those nominated will be contacted. The following Sunday, the members will be chosen by lot during a Mass at the corresponding parish, a commissioning prayer service will be held prior to the first meeting on October 3rd, 2021.

#### Responsibilities

The Council meets seven to ten times per year as a group to reflect on issues facing the community and to work with the clergy and staff to implement and evaluate the pastoral plan. The Council assists the Pastor and the Staff in longterm planning. The Council also liaises with the Parish Finance Councils as needed and runs the annual Pastoral Council election. Members sit on standing or ad hoc committees such as Prayer, Study, Evangelization, and Generosity.

#### Time Commitment and Term of Office

Council members will be elected to serve 2-year terms beginning in September 2021. Elections will be held for six seats (3 from each parish annually). Terms are renewable twice (no more than 4 years). The Pastor can appoint members ex officio as is required to best serve the community.

The time commitment is approximately 10 hours per month.

#### Qualifications

Any registered member of St. Camillus or St. Agnes Parishes may be nominated for consideration to be a member of the CPC. Those nominated should demonstrate the willingness to serve their fellow parishioner by furthering the mission of the Catholic Church. Some thoughts for consideration before nominating or accepting nomination:

- Are or have been involved in one or more of the CPC's ministries or groups
- Desire to contribute to the overall health of the **CPARL Faith Family**
- Enjoy looking at "the big picture"
- Desire to help people connect more deeply with each other and the Church
- Have a real heart for implementing the community's vision in the Pastoral Plan and helping the community determine "what comes next"

#### MUSIC NOTES from Roger

This week's hymn selections are specifically chosen to accompany our worship in a week which brings to mind thoughts of memorialization and Patriotism. As we arrive at the 20th Anniversary of 9/11, we all have a story of how it has impacted our lives, whether it

be directly through the loss of a loved one, the loss of someone connected to someone we know, or simply the fact that our country was attacked on our own shore for the first time in our lives. For those of us who lived through the Twin Towers attack, it has certainly changed our lives and the world in which we live. As I chose music for this specific weekend, I did not think about any of the politics that are associated with this terrible event, but attempted to simply look back to honor and memorialize all of the losses of that day, and those that have been lost in the subsequent twenty years. As a nation, we have certainly come to know loss and conflict. Thankfully, our Catholic faith provides us with comfort, including in the hymns we offer in worship.

The opening hymn, "For all the Saints," is well known to most of you. We always sing this hymn for All Saints Day as a memorial to those who have passed. While acknowledging the loss of loved ones, it also sings of the glory and promise of life beyond our worldly existence. I find great comfort in verse 4 as we sing, "there breaks a more glorious day."


"Be still my soul" during the offertory is a simple yet deeply meaningful hymn. The text tells of God's abiding care and that He is in control. We must be patient as we wait on his guidance. The familiar music is taken from that beautiful larger work by Jean Sibelius, Finlandia.

Our closing hymn, "America the Beautiful," needs no introduction. In my experience, this hymn has always been sung with 'gusto' here in our church. I would like to call your attention, however, the

second verse that we are singing this weekend: "O beautiful for heroes proved in liberating strife." I was not familiar with this verse but when I looked through the hymn, it jumped out to me as a perfect sentiment for our responders and protectors.

Those of you attending the 12 noon Mass at St Agnes will hear our quartet sing a beautiful piece by Felix Mendelssohn, "Grant Us Thy Peace." It is a paraphrase of the Latin hymn, Da pacem Domine, a hymn for peace from the 6th or 7th Century, based on biblical verse.

I hope that you will find comfort and meaning in these hymns as we remember a difficult time in our history. Let your voices be heard as we sing together as one worshipping body, one community praying for comfort and peace.

### REMEMBER THE POOR: FRANCISCAN FRIARY, DAY 1

I continue now with my vocation story. By the way, the telling of this journey through a monthly column may lack the chronological consistency for which some attention spans long. Nonetheless, sharing this

story during this month makes sense given my September 1st arrival in the friary.

This time of year is nostalgic, or mildly traumatic, for many people. Passing double-parked moving vans with parents and students scurrying up and down stairs like leaf-stripping ants, we can think back to college or young adult moving days. It also always rains on moving day, right? There are, however, some good memories. I recall making my mother giggle my freshman year. Before she left my room, I had her take a picture of me pretending to be on the phone. Back then before cell phone cameras and social media, silly pictures of such scenes seemed to mean more. In my future dorms, I decided to reproduce the photo over the next three years: same shirt, same shorts, same phone, same giggles. Four years after the original pose there were no giggles.

The month after college graduation, I chose to join the friars in New Bedford. I don't remember my mother being amused with me that moving day. On Labor Day, 2003, my grandparents met my mother and me for 9 am Mass. The parochial vicar, who was a helpful ear during my discernment, called me forward at the end of Mass for a special commissioning-blessing. Later at a breakfast diner, my grandparents pointed out the significance of the date. Over forty years to the day, they laid to rest their young son, Michael, after his fight with leukemia. Being his namesake and the beneficiary of his intercession, I saw this calendar alignment as Providential. But perhaps this news only comforted my grandmother and me.

There were four of us in the car for the drop-off in New Bedford. It felt like nana accompanied me and my sister was there to support my mother. My grandmother and mother walked me to the front door of the friary. The porter welcomed us into the foyer. I placed my stuffed backpack on the floor for our pleasant, yet brief, conversation. After the hugs and goodbyes, there was no phone and no picture.

I share my arrival in the friary to encourage each of us to pray for men and women who have recently taken the next step in their vocation. Prayers are also necessary for their family and friends. We need parish communities full of generous souls: some inching closer to their vocations, others providing prayer support, still others offering understanding ears or sound advice. I can tell you from experience that this process brings excitement, fear, and questions from all involved. I also know that my vocation is an answered prayer of people I have never met.




