

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC



Fr. Marc Bishop - Pastor St. Agnes and St. Camillus

Dear Faith Family,

This Sunday is the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time: The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This is the concluding Sunday of the Liturgical Year- Year B or the Year of St. Mark. It is called the Year of St. Mark because we

predominately read from St. Mark's Gospel on Sundays. However, we end the year with a reading from the Gospel of John (Jn 18:33b-37). John depicts the dialogue between Pilate and Jesus when Pilate asks Jesus: "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus does not directly answer Pilate. In fact, he asks Pilate questions instead of answering. When Jesus is pressed further he says: "My kingdom does not belong to this world...." And, it truly does not. Jesus is not the king of a finite place for a particular period of time. Jesus Christ is the King of the Universe- the Lord of all time and places. Christ is the witness to the Truth that He is.

Our role in this unfolding story of salvation is to be witness too. We witness by not being so concerned about this world. Rather we serve this world in order to orient people to the World to come. The fullness of Truth is to be found only in the eternal reality that is the Kingdom of God. Next week we begin the new liturgical year - the Year of St. Luke. Advent marks the beginning of our new Liturgical Year.

"Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight (Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, 39). As such Advent is a time of pensive anticipation for the coming of the Lord. To prepare ourselves properly we can benefit from acts of generosity, penance, and spiritual practices. It is like an abbreviated Lent. One way

that I have heard Advent described is the period of housecleaning before an honored and hoped-for guest arrives.

I pray that your Advent is one full of "expectant delight." God Bless, Fr. Marc

MUSIC NOTES from Roger

This week we find a very lively set of hymns for our celebration of "Christ the King." It is truly befitting that a Mass for this Sunday should be about high praise and affirmation of the Kingship of Jesus Christ. We open with "Crown Hymn with Many Crowns," a very familiar


hymn to us all. It's tune name, Diademata, is derived from the Greek, meaning "crowns." This hymn first appeared in 1851 and it originally had 12 verses. Each verse begins with a declaration of Jesus' Kingly estate: Crown him the virgins' Son; Lord of Lords; Lord of Peace; Lord of Heaven; Lord of Life; Lord of Love – just to name a few. The original final verse ends with "Crown him, ye kings, with many crowns, for He is Lord of All." The Offertory hymn, "Lift up your heads, O mighty gates," is taken from Psalm 24, a majestic song of praise to the King of Glory. This hymn of praise to Christ the King is also a foretelling of the coming of Christ. This hymn is appropriate at two liturgical points. Not only is it a hymn of praise to Christ the King, but with Advent upon us next week, it seems a fitting hymn for the coming of Christ. In fact, it is most often found in the Advent section of our hymn book as well as a suggested hymn for this day the final day of the liturgical year, the Solemnity of Christ the King. "Lift up your Heads," to the tune known as Truro, began to appear in various different hymnals by the mid-1800s.

Our recessional hymn, "To Jesus Christ our Sovereign King," is a real 'rouser' for congregations to sing. It is set to the German tune, Ich Glaub an Gott ("I believe in God"), and was first published in 1870 in the *Mainz Gesangbuch*, a Roman Catholic Hymnbook from the area of Mainz, Germany. One of the highlights of the hymn is its powerful refrain, "Christ Jesus, Victor! Christ Jesus, ruler! Christ Jesus, Lord and Redeemer!" Whenever I play this hymn in any church, I always marvel and how strongly and confidently the congregation sings.

It is interesting to note that all three of these hymns have come to us from the same time period, that of the mid-19th century. In fact, they all pre-date the establishment of the Feast Day of Christ the King in 1925 by Pope Pius XI. Is it just a coincidence that the mid-19th century produced such a lasting legacy of music; were the writers of hymnody on to something really special at that time in music history? That could be debated for a long time based on musical preference and musical ideology. What I do believe without question is very simple; these are examples of great hymns that have been revered by congregations for many decades and even centuries. They have obviously withstood the test of time and have endured. Two quotes from Pope Benedict XVI speak to the great traditions in our liturgies:

"What earlier generations held as sacred, remains sacred and great for us too..."

"Great music distends the spirit, arouses profound emotions and almost naturally invites us to raise our minds and hearts to God in all situations of human existence, the joyful and the sad. Music can become prayer."

SECOND READING, SECOND COLUMN: LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING **REVELATION 1:5-8**

Christ is our King. But who is sitting on his throne? Each November, the Church concludes the liturgical year

with the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. The Sunday and daily Mass readings point toward his kingship. Christ reigns now as king of the universe and he will return at the end of time in all his glory. Although this king reigns in heaven, his throne is of this earth. His throne is the human heart. He seeks to reign over our hearts out of love for us. This excerpt from the Book of Revelation sheds light on some aspects of this kingship.

Jesus Christ is the faithful witness (or prophet) of the Father's love for us. His public ministry, life, death, and resurrection prove this title. His power places him over all kings and rulers of this earth. At the same time, the blood of his cross turns his faithful subjects into priest-kings. He allows us Christians to share in his priesthood and in his kingship. As baptized priests, all Christians offer their lives to the Father. As kings, we live on this earth as children of the Father. We all have thrones awaiting us in heaven. This first section from Revelation alludes to these three offices of Christ. He is priest, prophet, and king. To show his glory, he makes us his priests, prophets, and kings. This Feast of Christ the King is the annual pause by which we reflect on our Christian dignity. Before we begin to prepare a place for the baby Jesus in Bethlehem, we reflect on this past year. Has Christ had the most important place in my heart? Have I lived 2021 as a priest, prophet, and king?

Both the end of the year (Christ the King) and its beginning (Advent) consider the end of time. Yes, this idea can be terrifying. It is part of humanity. At different moments during his passion, Christ

shows how our human nature recoils from suffering and death. How much more repulsive is end of the universe? But we can direct this fear toward doing something good. The Book of Revelation addresses this concern. Christ returns to reward us according to our deeds. He is the first and the last, the Alpha and the Omega. He is the first and last reasons why we do good things. If it is challenging for us to continue following Christ, this feast reminds us why we ask for his help and push ourselves. We can reignite our desire to reign with him in heaven. If we have fallen short as Christians, we have time now to confess our sins and profess our allegiance: Viva Cristo Rey!
