

# MESSAGE FROM FR MARC

Dear Faith Family,  
This Sunday we enter Ordinary Time, a season of growth in our liturgical calendar. This gives me a good opportunity to thank all who were so generous to our Parishes and me the holy Christmas season. Your gifts of time, talent, and treasure, are inspiring. Frankly, if it wasn't for

the generous gift of self of the lay ministers and ushers, we could not do all that we are doing. Thank you!

We are a faith family "Rooted in Tradition- Focused on the Future." St. Agnes Parish will celebrate its 150 Anniversary this year. We will start the celebrations and events on the Feast of St. Agnes, January 21st. The bulletin and email newsletter will have updates and events posted. These celebrations are not limited to the happenings on Medford Street, a reading of the history of the Church in Arlington makes it clear that 150 years ago the Catholic Faith found a home in Arlington. It did this when faced with forces that certainly were not happy to have a Catholic Church in Arlington. The memory of "NINA" and other anti-Catholic sentiments were very much still prevalent 150 years ago.

The church on Medford Street was founded as St. Malachy Church and in 1900, after an extensive remodeling and expansion, was renamed, Saint Agnes. We are celebrating the Catholic Faith being planted in Arlington. A faith that saw much growth and good works over the last century and a half: a faith that has developed in response to new trends and a community that has never forgotten the importance of worship and service.

An important part of our celebrations will be to mark all the gifts of the Catholic Communities in Arlington. To this end, if you have any pictures, stories, memorabilia, or the like that we can display, that exemplifies the Church in Arlington, we would welcome your contribution. Soon we will have designated space in our Churches to receive and display your faith treasures. This is not to create a museum of our faith's past. It is to be thankful for

where we began, to acknowledge blessings received, and to bolster ourselves for future works. Our 150th anniversary celebration will begin on the Feast of Saint Agnes - Friday, January 21st. All are invited to join us in-person or via livestream for a Holy Hour at Saint Agnes beginning at 6:30 PM. We will gather in Eucharistic Adoration and begin a 9-day Novena to Saint Agnes, concluding on Saturday, January 29th. A suggested Novena is below. ## SAINT AGNES NOVENA

"Novena" is derived from the Latin word for nine, or "novem." Typically, a novena refers to nine days of prayer, asking God for a specific intention, often through a Saint's intercession. Novenas can help you grow purposefully and consistently in daily prayer. We believe it's a powerful way to kick-off our year-long anniversary celebration.

Amen.



## Spirit of the Ordinary First Corinthians 12:4-11

Ordinary Time presents the perfect opportunity to ask for extraordinary grace. Some people, eager to drum up enthusiasm for these ‘normal’ Sundays, call it Extraordinary Time. I agree with this name if it encourages us to

pray for our daily portion of grace. From life milestones to everyday responsibilities, we all need help from heaven.

I have a bit of history with the second reading for this weekend. The school year before my Confirmation I started to go to youth group meetings at my church. These Sunday night gatherings were a lot of fun. The leaders decided to ask me and a girl classmate to proclaim the readings at our Confirmation Mass. I was eager and rather confident. On the day of the ceremony, the girl came down with laryngitis. So, one of the most popular girls in our class stepped right in and read perfectly. Her success made me confident to the extent of arrogance. “If she can do it with no preparation,” I reflected, “I’ll be fine.” Unfortunately, right from the beginning of this passage from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, I tripped over phrases, got terribly nervous, skipped some words, and felt like a dork. Later at my party, my father made it a point to help me learn from my embarrassment. I knew that the Holy Spirit gives special gifts during the Rite of Confirmation, but I (during the second reading) needed that help just a little earlier.

The Spirit does individually distribute his gifts to each person as the Spirit wishes. This news is good for all of us who need help. A mildly embarrassing faux pas, like my anxiety at the ambo, or a major life crisis, and every experience in between are all within the purview of the Holy Spirit. St. Paul outlines mighty deeds such as prophecy and gifts of healing. These extraordinary charisms, however, should not make us shy away from the Spirit. Instead, during Ordinary Time, we confidently ask God for what we need. This Pauline list also includes everyday necessities, such as faith and service. But even through these daily petitions, the Lord can surprise us. By answering humble requests, he may give faith to heroic

degrees. According to his plan, the Spirit produces all his gifts to benefit us.

Once Ordinary Time begins, many people may have already abandoned their New Year’s resolutions. We now have the chance to make one simple goal. When faced with a challenge of any size, we can say “Come, Holy Spirit.” This prayer alerts heaven to our requests. Please use my story as a small reminder to turn to the Spirit at any and every moment of need.

The week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Tuesday, January 18th. Please pray that all Christians will work together and bring peace in our troubled world. Pray that Christians of every race and color celebrate their oneness in Christ and that Christians of all traditions see each other in the face of Christ.

The Holy Father’s Intentions for this month is for human fraternity. We pray for all those suffering from religious discrimination and persecution, may their own rights and dignity be recognized, which originates from being brothers and sisters in the human family.

## MUSIC NOTES

*from Roger*

As we begin a new calendar year, I would like to announce a new opportunity for youth music involvement in our liturgies.

Although we have not yet brought our choirs back to full strength due to Covid issues,

cantors have provided safe musical leadership at Mass.

For the new year, we are beginning a Junior Cantor Program for our 9:00 AM Mass at St. Agnes Church. This opportunity will be open to Middle and High School students. Youth cantors will meet together following the 9:00 AM Mass in the choir loft to prepare for future Masses. This rehearsal time will allow youth to learn Mass Parts, hymns, and responsorial psalms. I have been asking my 14-year-old daughter Lizzie to consider singing at Mass. She finally got up the courage and gave me a Christmas gift of several ‘cantor coupons’ that I can redeem. Naturally, as a dad, I’m thrilled to work with her to teach her the music, but I also thought that it would be a good time to extend the invitation to our young people to get more involved in our worship.

Singing as a cantor can be a great boost in self-confidence for any individual, especially for youth. Singers will learn more about the techniques of singing, the Catholic liturgy, and how the Mass travels along through music. Serving as a cantor gives a person a full view of why we do what we do at Mass. Beyond this, singing at Mass is an opportunity to give back to God the voice that He has given to you. All that is required is the courage to give it a try. Being able to sing in tune and match pitch is also a good place to start. If you enjoy singing with your school chorus or in musical shows, the Junior Cantor program is a way to bring your gifts forward to your community – and to God. This could also lead to the eventual formation of a youth choir.

Please prayerfully consider getting involved in a Junior Cantor Program. If your child or grandchild or family friend loves singing, please share this information with them. It will be wonderful to bring the joyful sound of young voices to our 9:00 AM Mass.

The Junior Cantor Program will have our first meeting on January 23 after the 9:00 AM Mass upstairs in the Choir Loft. We will meet for about a half-hour. Come see what all the singing is about!

## THE PRAYER PROCESS—10 MINUTES A DAY

Resolutions are what we want to achieve. A habit shapes who we want to become. The habit of prayer is essential to spiritual growth.

### 1. GRATITUDE

Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for today.

### 2. AWARENESS

Revisit the times in the past twenty-four hours when you were and were not the best-version-of-yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you have learned from them.

### 3. SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS

Identify something you experienced today and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).

### 4. PEACE

Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed (against yourself, another person, or him) and to fill you with a deep and abiding peace.

### 5. FREEDOM

Speak with God about how he is inviting you to change your life, so that you can experience the freedom to be the-best-version-of-yourself.

### 6. OTHERS

Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.

### 7. CLOSE

By praying the Our Father

God has an incredible dream for each and every one of us. He wants you to become the best-version-of-yourself as His child.


