

MESSAGE FROM FR MARC





Fr. Marc Bishop - Pastor St. Agnes and St. Camillus

Dear Faith Family,

"For this is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me."

These words are part of the institution narrative prayed by the priest at Mass during the Eucharistic

Prayer. In these words, Christ speaks to his apostles and His Church communicating the fullness of His mission. His mission is to heal the division caused by sin. It is both personal and communal. It is not individual in the sense that is it not exclusive. Although, worthy reception requires readiness and preparedness. Jesus offers us His very self in the Eucharist that we may be witnesses to His mission.

This is one way to view ourselves as disciples of Christ. We are sharers in His mission. We do this by personally engaging with grace. To do that, we need to be intentionally people of prayer and invitation.

When I pray those words, I am very aware that I am speaking in the voice of Christ. When I truly allow myself to fully engage with the moment my hands shake and my voice trembles. The profound invitation of Christ to receive Him and share Him is overwhelming. God has called all of us to receive Him and share Him, to be a Eucharistic people. He has chosen each of us to be instruments of the means of salvation. He gave Himself to us and we in turn share Him with others.

Let us have the courage to be disciples of Christ: members of the body of Christ, the suffering and victorious servant of God.

An important way people share the grace of Christ is within the blessing of a sacramental marriage. To honor this, next weekend at the 10 AM and Noon Masses those married sacramentally are invited to renew their commitment to each other and Christ. This brief rite will take place at the conclusion of the Prayers of the faithful; all Masses conclude with a blessing of Married Couples.

Almighty and eternal God, You blessed the union of married couples so that they might reflect the union of Christ with his Church: look with kindness on them. Renew their marriage covenant, increase your love in them, and strengthen their bond of peace so that, with their children, they may always rejoice in the gift of your blessing. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Share Your Story

My uncle, Francis "Happy" Ahern, a 1929 St. Agnes School graduate and St. Agnes parishioner, led an eventful life. He grew up on Wyman Terrace in East Arlington. As a toddler, he fell through the ice on Spy Pond and his life was saved by a nearby skater, George Gallerani, of Cambridge. The heroic Mr. Gallerani, age 32, drowned in the process of saving him.


In his high school years, Francis was a Boy Scout and achieved eagle scout status. At Arlington High School, he was the quarterback on the football team and president of the student council. After graduation, he enrolled at Boston University. During his sophomore year, 1934, he accompanied his uncle on a business trip to Mexico City. While there, under mysterious circumstances, he was shot and killed. He was 19 years old. His body was transported by train back to Boston.

News reports stated that his funeral, held at St. Agnes Church, had the largest attendance ever seen in Arlington. Of note, one of the pallbearers was his first cousin, and future speaker of the house of the U.S. House of Representatives, Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr.

Besides my uncle, my other connection to St. Agnes parish is that my mother, Regina (Ahern)

Harvey, was a St. Agnes School (1935) graduate and St. Agnes parishioner. My father, James E. Harvey, her Arlington High classmate, was a St. James parishioner. Their wedding took place in 1951 at St. Agnes Church.

The window of St. Paul's conversion

This week I invite you to reflect on this beautiful window of St. Paul's conversion from St. Camillus Church. We celebrated this feast two weeks ago on January 25th. Saul was born to a Jewish parent in Tarsus which is now

in Turkey. As of Luke's account, Saul was a tentmaker, and he learned the scripture from his teacher, Gamaliel. Saul was an ardent Jew, and he was a Pharisee of the tribe of Benjamin (Philippians 3:5). It is possible that Saul would have been present in the crowd and incited the mob to murder St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. St. Luke recorded that Stephen's executioners laid their garments at the foot of Saul (Acts 7:58). But it is amazing that God called this sinner and murderer to be the preacher of the Gospel.

On his way to Damascus to arrest Christians, Saul encountered the risen Christ and became the apostle. Paul's conversion is one of the dramatic conversions in Church history because God calls this sinful man to be the apostle of gentiles. Out of 27 books in the New Testament, thirteen of them were written by Paul.

Dear friends, like St. Paul, we too persecute Christ when we sin against Him. St. Paul's conversion is a poignant reminder for all of us that though we are Christians for many years, we need to convert from our sinfulness to holiness and from our doubt to faith, despair to hope. After his conversion, Paul worked tirelessly for the unity of early Christians. Like Paul, we too are called to work for unity first in our homes and then in society.

That is why the founder of atonement father Paul is depicted at the bottom of the window along with Sr. Lurana who was the co-foundress of the Atonement order. Initially, these founders were the Episcopalians, and then they became Catholics and worked for Church's unity. Then, you can see the symbol of doubting Thomas on the right side of the window. The tradition holds that Thomas, who

doubted Jesus' resurrection, after his encounter with Christ went to India to proclaim the Gospel. There, he sacrificed his life for our faith in Chennai from where I come. We still have his tomb, and upon his tomb, we built the beautiful Basilica in honor of St. Thomas. Then on the left side of the window, you can see the consecrated hand of a

priest giving counsel.

Dear friends, this window of St. Paul's conversion reflects our own sinful lives. St. Paul reminds us that we have to renew ourselves through frequent confession and turn towards Christ. Like Ananias who helped Saul to encounter Christ, we too have to help others to see Christ.

MUSIC NOTES from Roger

While the weather reminds daily us we have deeply settled into a New England midwinter, liturgically, we are still in the beginning weeks of Ordinary Time. This Sunday is the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, unlike the Sundays from last November

leading up to the season of Advent, where they were well into the thirties in number. What do we mean by Ordinary Time? Simply put, Ordinary Time refers to those parts of the Catholic Church's liturgical year that aren't included in the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. During Ordinary Time, the scripture readings focus on the events of Jesus' life between his birth, death and resurrection; that is, more of a focus on his life and public ministry among the people. The name of the season is from the word ordinal, meaning "to count." We call it Ordinary Time because the weeks are named in number order. We use the color green in church during Ordinary Time, both for the priest's vestments and the altar colors. Green is meant to represent the anticipation and hope of the resurrection of Christ.

All this being said, in a few short weeks we will be entering once again the season of Lent. It comes a bit later in the calendar this year, with Ash Wednesday on March 2 as the start of the season, however, it still seems like the change in liturgical seasons comes rather quickly. We will shift from green to purple, as we do each year. We will shift again to the simplified, reflective nuances in Lenten music and worship.

I can't help but express gratitude for the familiarity of the liturgical seasons. We can't predict the weather with certainty, we can't precisely pin down when the pandemic will officially be over, but we can count on the Church, her seasons, and the faithful witness to the Good News at Mass.

Gospel Reflection

Luke 5:1-11

In this weekend's Gospel, we hear Jesus calling his disciples to a new vocation as the "fisher of men." This passage offers rich possibilities for reflecting on how God calls ordinary people to discipleship and mission.

Consider:

What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?

"The crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God."

When have I been eager to hear the word of God? How can I be more enthusiastic about learning and sharing my father?

"Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When have I felt that my efforts are in vain? When have I felt that Jesus is supporting me in those efforts?

"Do not be afraid."

What am I afraid of? Do I approach God with honesty and a trustful heart?

"They left everything and followed him." What prevents me from following Jesus more closely? What sinful behaviors do I need to abandon?



In the year King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple. Seraphim were stationed above.



Then I said, "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding an ember that he had taken with tongs from the altar.

He touched my mouth with it, and said, "See, now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged."

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send Who will go for us?" "Here I am," I said; "send me!"

But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. Indeed, I have toiled harder than all of them; not I, however, but the grace of God that is with me. Therefore, whether it be I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

GOSPEL

Lk 5: 1-11

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking,

he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.






