

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC

Dear Faith Family,

Last week I quoted from the Ceremonial of Bishops: “The annual observance of Lent is a special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both

the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery... The faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal “promise” (Ceremonial of Bishops, 249).

Lent is a distinct period of time in which the Christian is called to deliberately participate in an Examination of Conscience. This is not a practice with the intent to trap people in guilt. It is the opposite. It is a path to freedom. Freedom is only possible after honest self-assessment. We see Peter’s making a self-assessment when he says: “Depart from me, Lord for I am a sinful man” (see Mt 5:1-11). Jesus responds to Peter by missioning him: “Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men” (ibid). When we acknowledge our fragility to God and to ourselves personal and spiritual growth is possible. This recognition is required to experience the joy of freedom in Christ and to aid others in discovering Christ the healer.

There are many forms of examinations of conscience. The two that I find most helpful are the Ten Commandments (Ex 20: 1-18) and the Beatitudes (Mt 5: 3-12). Frequently, I take a few minutes to read the Ten Commandants or the Beatitudes from Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount, a slow, deliberate, and thoughtful reading. I find it great preparation for the Sacrament of Confession. It inspires me to desire a reconciled heart with the living God. I pray it brings you the peace with which it graces me.

The third night of our Mission will be a Reconciliation Service. Please, join us for all four nights. It is a moment to encounter the healing of

Christ and to support each other as a Faith Family.

Last week, Fr. Mathais Chungu, SMA sent me an update on the project to build a Church. St. Theresa of Lisieux (the Child Jesus) Parish was founded in 2004 and currently has 1,700 members. The parish consists of 14 small Christian communities and 28 Lay Groups. He provided concept pictures of the new Church building. He also sent pictures from the Parish School that serves children from kindergarten through elementary school. The school has a department for children with special needs. We will be updating our website with the new information sent to us and more as it is available. Thank you for supporting this worthwhile project.

MUSIC NOTES

from Roger

We begin this season of Lent with a different sound and character to our worship. We will be using the Chant Mass settings for the sung portions of the liturgy which include *Lord Have Mercy, Holy Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Amen* and *Lamb of God*. The *Glory to God* is not sung during Lent. In addition, the Cantor will sing the entrance antiphon just prior to the opening hymn, and the Mass will conclude with singing the Marian Hymn, *Ave Regina Caelorum* as we have done in the past. The Mass will have a quieter, prayerful spirit. The hymns will be more reflective and penitential in nature and very direct in their Lenten themes.

During these five weeks of Lent, we make a greater intention to be closer to God through prayer and personal reflection. It is our aim to create a prayerful spirit in our worship to help see us through these 40 days of healing and renewal as we journey with our Lord to the tomb and Easter Resurrection. I pray that the musical offerings during Lent will aid your prayer life and assist you in this journey.

On another note, with the lifting of the mask mandate, we are starting to bring our choirs back in the Catholic Parishes of Arlington. If you have a desire to sing in the choir, please contact me at St Agnes or Kristyn McKenna at St Camillus.

THE WINDOW OF JESUS GIVES COMFORT TO THE AFFLICTED

- St. Camillus.

As we celebrate the First Sunday of Lent - the Gospel of Luke presents to us Jesus' temptation in the desert. After having been baptized in the Jordan river, Jesus was led by

the Spirit into the desert for forty days to be tempted by Devil. The scripture states that Jesus ate nothing during those days and Satan tempted Him with food and worldly power. However, Jesus did not fail against Satan's test, and He had overcome those temptations with his fervent prayer and fasting. We have begun the Lenten season with the celebration of Ash Wednesday this past week -the Lenten Season is a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. By offering these three Lenten observances, the Church facilitates us to enter into the spiritual desert of our hearts to overcome the daily temptations of this world.

For this week's stained-glass window reflection, we see Jesus confronts the leader of a band of demons. In this window, you can see the possessed man wearing a shabby cloth and living in the tomb. He was naked, exceedingly fierce, handcuffed, and uncontrollable - he was constantly crying and cutting himself with the stones. Here, we can feel the pain of the victim, he was in need of Jesus' healing and restoration. "When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell at his feet, shouting at the top of his voice, "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, don't torture me! And they begged Jesus to cast them into the pigs." (Lk 8:28,32). And there was a spring of water running from steep rock which is portrayed behind Jesus in the window. And Jesus ordered them to go into the herds of pigs, When the demons came out of the man, they went into the pigs, and the herd rushed down from the steep and drowned in the lake. (Lk 8:33). In the scripture, a pig is a symbol of uncleanness and that's why Jesus cast's out the demons into the pigs.

Dear friends, today's Gospel and this week's stained-glass window portray two important aspects of Jesus. First, our Lord is a victor over the demons, and

second, He is a comforter. First, our Lord is a victor because He won a victory over Satan through his death on the cross and that's why the cross is depicted on the left side of the window. The jar of oil and cloth is portrayed in the window because they prefigure Jesus' crucifixion. So, the cross is a symbol of Christianity, and it is the weapon against Satan.

Second, Jesus' action here in the window portrays Jesus as a comforter. By casting out the demons, Jesus gives him comfort and freedom. That's why Father Damien of Molokai was portrayed at the bottom of the window, giving comfort to the dying leper with the crucifix in his hand. Father Damien was born in Belgium and joined the society of Jesus and Mary and was sent as a missionary to serve among the Hawaiian lepers in the USA.

So dear friends, the crucifix is not a symbol of suffering, but a symbol of victory and blessings. It is through the cross; Jesus won a victory over Satan and show us the way to heaven. Lent is a time to gaze our eyes on the cross. So, during these forty days of Spiritual journey in the desert, let us embrace the cross of Jesus, and drive out our daily temptations. The best way to overcome the temptation of sin is to approach the sacrament of reconciliation frequently. St. John Maria Vianney says, "when you have made a good confession, you have chained up the devil."

Our parish is organizing the Lenten Mission from March 14th to March 17th at St. Camillus Church.

Let us make use of this time of spiritual healing through frequent confession and allow Jesus to touch the darkness of our souls.
