SECOND READING, SECOND COLUMN: Shepherd & Lamb Revelation 7: 9, 14b-17

One of my priest-professors in the seminary used to say that a tiny little word is essential to Theology: the adverb “as.” He could easily say it since “as” is vital to all kinds of communication. When we talk to people about news, weather, or sports we are capable of all kinds of grammatical acrobatics. A story can impact us “as” an American. A homeowner can see the storm of the century “as” terrifying. Or a super fan views his team in the playoffs “as” the biggest story of the day. “As” Christians, we need this same type of flexibility when we think about Christ. The readings this weekend present Our Lord under different aspects, but teach a common lesson.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is always Good Shepherd Sunday. “We are his people, the sheep of his flock” seems pretty simple to understand. There is a satisfying harmony among the psalm, the Alleluia verse, and Gospel. We can think of Christ “as” a shepherd. He leads us by his voice. He protects us as the Good Shepherd. Each year, one of three sections of the Gospel of John, Chapter 10, reveals Christ as the Good Shepherd.

But, then the second reading from “The Book of Revelation” compares Christ to a ‘lamb.’ What? The heavenly vision presents a Lamb ruling from a throne. The blood of this Lamb, who was slain, allows Christians to enter heaven.

We, however, do not have to choose between seeing Christ “as” a lamb or “as” a shepherd. He is both. As God, Christ is our Shepherd guiding and protecting us because he is superior to us. As man, Christ is one of us. We are his sheep, he is the shepherd, but he became a sheep to save the sheep. The Gospel and “Revelation” both contain the imagery of Christ as a lamb and shepherd. Earlier in John’s Gospel, it is said of Christ that he is the “Lamb of God.” In this very passage for today from

“Revelation” the lamb shepherds those who suffer on earth.

This mental flexibility toward Christ helps us Christians in our daily lives. We can better recognize Christ in the distressing disguise of the poor. We can also thank him when he speaks to us through people who love us or even challenge us.

MAY IS FOR MARY


The faithful are called to honor our Blessed Mother during May, and encouraged to ask for her intercession, particularly for peace!

MUSIC NOTES *from Roger*

This week, often called “Good Shepherd Sunday,” reflects the imagery of God as the shepherd. In Revelations 7 we find the verse, “For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne, will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water.” Then in the Gospel reading from John 10 we hear Jesus say, “My sheep hear my voice; I know them and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish.” Interestingly, we see the image of Christ as both Lamb and Shepherd. For me, Christ the sacrificial lamb is a difficult image, especially after reading two accounts of the Passion story just a few weeks ago during Holy Week. I know that for me, the thought of what Jesus endured for us is a difficult image to see in my mind’s eye. I know that it is at the center of our faith, but its violence and brutality are truly overwhelming. In my role as a church musician, familiar with so much hymnody, the violence that Christ the Lamb endured for us immediately brings to mind the hymn, “What Wondrous Love is This.”

In contrast, many of us find the image of Jesus our shepherd a very comforting thought. Whether it as the noun “shepherd,” or the verb “shepherding,” we know that in Christ we are safe. The shepherds that lived and worked during Christ’s life however, were known to be very rough men who lived a life on the hillsides battling the elements. Despite this, they kept their flocks safe from other animals and perils. We think of Jesus the Shepherd in the vision of a gentle loving and caring guardian who is lovingly watching over us.

Our offertory hymn this week, “My Shepherd will supply my need,” is one of the most beautiful paraphrases of the 23rd Psalm. The lovely melodic and gentle hymn-tune Resignation, upon which it is set, helps to further the beautiful and pastoral image of a loving shepherd. Combining the image of Christ, the protective Shepherd with the knowledge that Christ the Lamb was sacrificed for us leads me to reflect: How can I be a shepherd for those who need protection, sacrificing my own comforts for those around me?



CARING FOR OUR VULNERABLE NEIGHBORS!

On Sunday, May 1st, our Village families, along with members of our broader collaborative family came together to create **150 care kits** for Boston-area individuals and families currently experiencing homelessness. Each care kit included toiletries, snacks, socks, and more. Basic, everyday necessities that many of us take for granted but mean so much to those who are less fortunate. There was an over abundance of snacks collected that will be donated to Arlington Eats. We are so grateful and humbled by the generosity of our community.

The care kits will be donated to the Boston Health Care for the Homeless Program (BHCHP) a team of 400 clinicians that offer comprehensive and compassionate medical, dental, and psychiatric services to the most vulnerable members of our society. They serve over 11,000 patients each year at 45 locations.

SAFETY TEAM COLLABORATIVE SURVEY

The Safety Team works to ensure that our parish collaborative and school communities continue to be safe places for all children and vulnerable adults. The team meets on a monthly bases and works in partnership with the Archdiocese of Boston and the Town of Arlington's public safety agencies. Past initiatives have centered on facilities management and safety of the buildings, AED training, compliance with appropriate background checks, and VIRTUS training. Current initiatives focus on education and raising awareness of specific safety concerns by bringing knowledgeable and experienced speakers to the parish collaborative for lectures and discussions. How was the Safety Team of the Catholic Parishes of Arlington come formed?

In September of 2018, through an announcement in the bulletins, our pastor, Fr. Marc Bishop, submitted a call for volunteers from the parishes to form a "Safety Team" in an effort to coordinate and consolidate new and ongoing initiatives to protect children and vulnerable adults in our church and school communities. The call, in part, came in response to the renewed and rising outrage and concern of the U.S. Catholic community after the release of the Pennsylvania report in August 2018 regarding the history of sexual abuse by priests and cover-ups by bishops in those dioceses. The formation of this team created an opportunity for parishioners within our new collaborative and with the support of our new leadership to respond to this crisis in our church. Roughly 15-20 members of the St. Camillus and St. Agnes Parishes and school communities responded to this call.
