Second Column: "Special Sundays"

Romans 5: 1-5

Many people have hobbies, unique interests, or pastimes. With God's help, these activities can enhance our lives and bless others. Certainly, the opposite is possible. Spending too much time on distractions or destruction has terrible consequences. But, I want to focus on the bright side of hobbies. In college, I took on "being Catholic" as a hobby. I didn't think of it that way. I'm sure perhaps that my classmates (who were into video games, costume role-playing on the quad, or their 'a cappella' group) looked at my time in the Newman Catholic room as just another hobby.

I saw it as ministry. Peer ministry. Helping my classmates seeking to live as Catholics and reaching out to fallen away students were the types of things I did between athletics and studying. Part of this work involved learning about the Liturgy. If I wanted to volunteer at Mass and plan meaningful experiences of prayer for my friends, I needed to know my stuff. One of the areas that was of first importance was the Lectionary. Inviting others to lector at Mass and leading Sunday readings Bible studies meant I had to know how to find the readings and explain them. As you can imagine, it was a great preparation for becoming a priest.

Through campus ministry, I gained an appreciation for the brilliance of the organization it took for the Church to construct the Lectionary. Of course, the Holy Spirit guided these theologians, but they also cooperated with that grace. The special Sundays in the Church calendar added to my amazement. Today, for example, is Trinity Sunday. It is always the first Sunday after Easter. It occurs during Ordinary Time but brings with it the glory of Easter.

I love how the Church chooses the perfect

readings to narrate such a great feast. The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans. The Apostle praises God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Faith Christ Jesus gives us access to God's glory. But, that road to glory contains afflictions. The Spirit, however, uses these struggles to mold our character by the love of God.

I am so thankful that now my hobby is my full time job. I thank the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Perhaps you are also thankful for your interests and activities. Trinity Sunday is the perfect opportunity to reflect on how your God-given gifts and talents have blessed you and other people.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

In the Lectio Divina form of prayer, we read the Gospel two to three times and reflect on the words or phrases that speak to our heart.

Consider—What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?

Jesus said, "*I have much more to tell you.*"

Ask yourself...

- What would Jesus have to say to me right now?
- What would be 'too much' for me to hear?

"When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth"

- What impulses and addictions drive my attitudes and actions?
- Where do I need help from the Holy Spirit?

"He ... will declare to you the things that are coming."

- What anxieties do I have about the future?
- Can I sit quietly with Jesus and allow him to speak to my heart?

After a period of silent reflection recite the Lord's Prayer.

Music Notes from Roger

Our Offertory hymn this week, although set here with a text for Trinity Sunday, is probably one of the best known hymn tunes in all of Christendom, *Old Hundredth*. The hymn tune is attributed to the French Composer, Louis Bourgeois who served as cantor and master of the choristers at St. Pierre and St. Gervais under the pastoral leadership of John Calvin in the mid 1500's. The tune was originally associated with Psalm 134 in the Genevan Psalter; however, the melody receives its current name from an association with the 100th Psalm, in a translation by William Kethe entitled, "All People that on Earth Do Dwell." As I was reading about the composer and the hymn tune, one article mentioned that he used his choristers to help teach these new hymn tunes to the congregation. I had to chuckle to myself as I thought that perhaps even in the mid 1500's there was controversy in church when a 'new' song was introduced into the liturgy.

Our recessional hymn is no stranger to us. Published in over 1500 different hymnals, "Holy, Holy, Holy" is perhaps one of the best known and most often sung hymns for Trinity Sunday. Its tune name *Nicaea* is named for the Council of Nicaea (A.D. 325) where church leaders debated the doctrine of the Trinity. What resulted was the Nicene Creed. It was this creed that inspired Reginald Heber to write this hymn of praise to the Triune God. It was later set to music by composer John B. Dykes in the mid 19th Century. This hymn evokes a sense of awe at the majesty of God, and calls on all of creation to praise the Godhead three-in-one.

The Catholic Villages of Arlington, formerly known as Religious Education or CCD, offer gatherings, resources, and faith formation throughout the entire year, for families with children from toddlers to grade 12!

Designed to include parent participation, our goal is to help strengthen the faith life of the whole family. Through our faith formation process, we hope that families will come to a fuller and richer experience of the presence of God in their lives and grow in their mission of being Christ's disciples in the world.

Every family is unique, as is their faith journey. Our hope is to help guide and support parents and families along their faith pathway! This year many of our resources will be from Faith and Family Life Catholic Ministries. Their Pathways Formation Suite is an integrated and family centered formation suite designed to facilitate a personal encounter with the Trinity and sustain a lifelong development of faith within the family. We are all at different points on the journey and a one size faith formation program does not fit all!

All of the Pathways resources encourage at-church community even if the majority of the catechesis is happening in the home. Community is essential in the life of the Church and we desire for families to gather often to support one another. The premier weekly gathering is Sunday Mass. It is our prayer that as families fall in love with Jesus and their community, that they would hunger to live in a weekly communion available to them at the Mass!

All CPARL families will typically begin their Faith Formation process using two resources from Pathways - Seek followed by Root.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the Catholic Villages of Arlington?

Each Village is a group of 4 - 6 households of varying sizes and make-ups (adults, youth, and children) that gather for Worship, Prayer, Study, and Community - also known as the Core Acts.

What are the Core Acts?

Acts 2:42 tells us that the early Christians "devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers." The Core Acts for the Villages are modeled on the devotions of the early Christians - Worship, Prayer, Study, Community.

How often do Villages gather?

Villages gather at least monthly but are encouraged to gather more frequently.

What about Sacramental Preparation?

Children and young people preparing to celebrate Reconciliation for the first time, Communion for the first time, and/or Confirmation will have a supplemental process for immediate preparation.

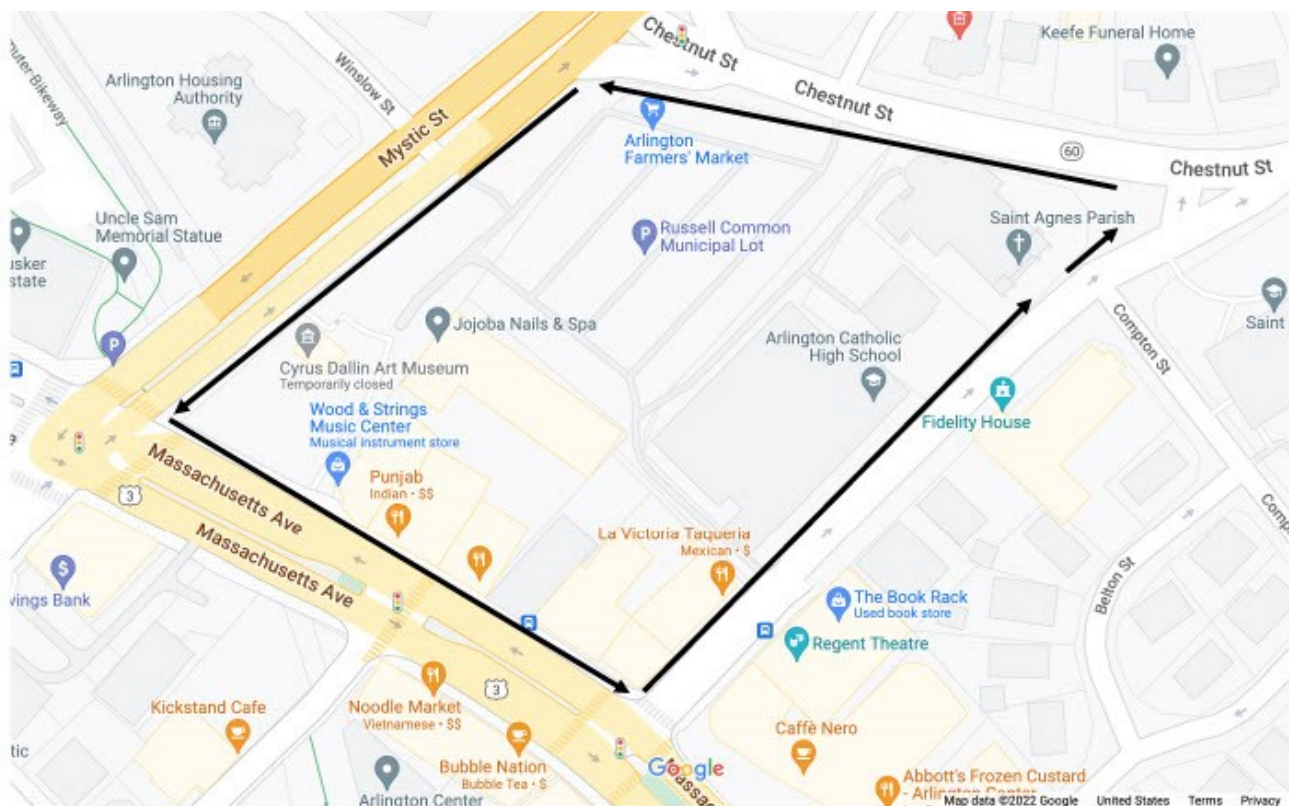
What is a Eucharistic Procession?

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. A Eucharistic procession, therefore, is a public witness of the veneration toward the most holy Eucharist, conducted through public streets. It takes place in this way: A consecrated host – that is, the real and substantial presence of Jesus Christ: body, blood, soul and divinity – is placed within a monstrance, which is then lifted and carried by a priest who leads the faithful in procession. Like a pilgrimage, a Eucharistic procession normally starts at one holy place and ends at another. This earthly journey reminds the Catholic faithful of their spiritual journey toward eternal life with God.

By processing with the Holy Eucharist in a

reverent, prayerful and joyful manner, Catholics can honor Christ in the Eucharist and serve as witnesses to the intimate presence of God in the world and in each individual. Processions powerfully display the Incarnation, or God becoming human, and thus speak of his merciful love for all who journey to eternal life with him.

During Eucharistic Processions, “the Christian people give public witness of faith and to their devotion toward this sacrament” (Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass, 101). By publicly proclaiming belief in Jesus’ True Presence in the Eucharist, we have an opportunity to invite the broader community to ask questions about the Eucharist and encounter Christ as the Blessed Sacrament is brought to them directly on the streets. In today’s culture, it is the witness of your faith that can build trust and rouse curiosity among members of our community who on their own might not approach the Church. As Pope Francis has said, “Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others, and this can happen unexpectedly and in any place: on the street, in a city square, during work, on a journey” (Evangelii Gaudium, 127).

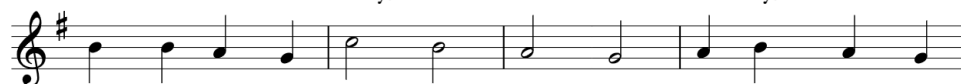

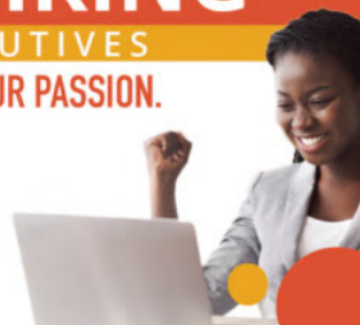
