## REMEMBER THE POOR: HOLY HOUR

When I joined the Franciscans in 2003, I was drawn to them by externals. The coarse robes, the austere beards, and the lack of money all added to the adventure of the life. But, the internal

realities are what kept me there for years. Sure, it was exciting not knowing where our food would come from, but the struggle to pray well was a more beneficial and interior struggle.

Before I joined the friars, I was intimidated by their commitment to prayer. They chose to make two hours of silent mental prayer in their daily schedule. One night at our community dinner, after having spent an hour in the chapel, I asked the rest of the brothers: "What are we supposed to do during our holy hours?" It sparked a good discussion. Over time, I learned that these hours of meditation and Eucharistic adoration are the most important hours of our day.


Then in my second year of religious life in the friary, that commitment to prayer became even more vital. Our novice master asked us four novices to make an extra holy hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament each day. This "novice hour" immediately impacted our lives. Because the novitiate is a quieter and more contemplative year of discernment, our works of charity were greatly reduced. We focused rather on prayer, study, and manual labor.

The novice hour was more important than work. It was a challenge to find time to pray this extra hour even with our curtailed responsibilities. Work would also creep into our novice hour as a distraction. In the life of St. Francis, he once was distracted at prayer by a cup he was making. To apologize to the Lord, we cast the unfinished vessel into the fire. None of us wanted to burn-up the work of our hands, so we fought against these distractions. Finding this balance and setting prayer as paramount were all parts of the exercise.

We novices learned about the various approaches to spirituality in the Church. In one way or another, we attempted to incorporate some of these methods into our prayer lives. Few teachings helped me more than this quaint tale from the life of St. John Vianney. One day, the saint asked an old farmer what he did while sitting in front of the tabernacle for so long. "Nothing," he replied, "I look at him and He looks at me." It is difficult, however, to pray a holy hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament. But, as difficult as it is, not praying to our Lord in the Eucharist makes life more difficult. So, I asked Christ to help me to be less distracted and more open to the Holy Spirit.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). By our devotion during Mass, the procession, or just quiet time in the church, we show our faith in this truth: Jesus is here for us. He looks at us; we look at Him. He can guide us through our distractions and bless our lives.

If you have never made a holy hour or if you know what I mean by this salutary struggle, please take time soon to adore the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Before or after Mass or during a quick visit during the week, take the opportunity to speak to him, listen, or just look at Him.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

### The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today we mark the feast of Corpus Christi - or translated - the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It celebrates the mystery central to our Mass - the real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, ordinary bread and wine will be transformed into the Body and Blood Christ who comes to dwell within us. The One who nourishes us. The One who reached out to those most in need. Jesus forgave the sinner, ate with the outcast, defended, and fed those who were poor and hungry. He worked for true justice, risked being unpopular, willingly accepted suffering and death, and always stayed connected to his Father. The Eucharist is the Body of Christ. The One we are called to follow.

This is the Body of Christ. In each of us, Jesus finds his dwelling place. We are all tabernacles of the Lord. When the gift of the Eucharist takes root in our hearts, we can more readily see the face of Christ in others.

This is the Body of Christ. So great is this mystery that at every Mass, we pray, "I am not worthy...but only say the word, and my soul will be healed. Christ came to a broken world, becoming like us to reconcile us to God.

This is the Body of Christ. When you receive the Eucharist, consider how weightless it feels. Yet, it carries the weight of the world. The One who calmed the storm. The One who healed the lepers. The One who gave sight to the blind and fed the hungry.

Sunday afternoon, we will proclaim that to the world in a procession around the neighborhood. We will sing hymns of praise and show those around us what we believe, what we cherish, what we venerate, this "gift of finest wheat" that satisfies our hungry hearts.

This is the Body of Christ.

### Music Notes from Roger

This weekend we have the **Eucharistic Procession** following the 12:00 Noon Mass at St Agnes Church. You will notice in the Worship Aid that there is a second Recessional Hymn. "Eat This Bread" will be sung as the

Recessional Hymn at the noon Mass and will serve as the start of the Eucharistic Procession. The Liturgical Procession will recess as usual from the Altar and the congregation may get in line as the procession moves out singing this hymn. "Eat this Bread" is a Taizé Chant by Jacques Berthier, and is meant to be sung as a mantra, that is, repeated over and over, making it well suited for the procession.

Our hymns this weekend are very Eucharisticcentered as we are celebrating Corpus Christi Sunday, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord. The opening hymn is taken right out of the chant for the transfer of the Holy Eucharist in the Holy Thursday liturgy. The Offertory Hymn, "Lord, Who at Thy First Eucharist," is one of the longest Eucharistic Hymns that we have. We will most likely not get through singing all of the verses at the Offertory, but I left them all in the bulletin hoping that at some point you will read through the entire text. It makes a wonderful devotional prayer; particularly in the second and third verses where the focus turns more toward praying for an end to divisions among us and bringing people back to the church. Share this hymn with your family and may your Corpus Christi celebration be fulfilling.

Also, a very Happy Father's Day to all you Dads out there. Like many of you, I suspect that I'll be working the 'grill' later on this afternoon with my family.

## FAITH FORMATION



The Faith Formation program at CPARL is designed to strengthen the faith life of the whole family, through parental participation. Parents have the greatest influence on the faith of their children. Through our faith formation process, we hope that families will come to a fuller and richer experience of the presence of God in their lives and grow in their mission of being Christ's disciples in the world.

All CPARL families will typically begin their Faith Formation process using two resources from Pathways - Seek followed by Root.



Our first Faith Formation Pathways experience for families is Seek! Families with children in PK to grade 9 will begin Seek this October. Seek fosters a personal experience with 3 different tracks for children, teens, and parents, with age appropriate content for each. Over the course of 4 Family Sessions at-church, families will be invited on a journey to discover anew the good news of our faith.

Through discussions, activities, reflections, witnesses, and teachings children, teens, and parents will get to know a God who is love and be given a shared vocabulary to begin conversations of faith as a family at-home. Seek Family Sessions will begin and end with families gathered together, in the middle of the session there will be age appropriate small group break outs.

Seek sessions will be monthly, with options on Sundays or Mondays. The dates will be:

Following Seek, the next Faith Formation Pathways experience for families will typically be Root. Families with children in PK to grade 9 will begin Root in March 2023.

Root is a foundational catechetical experience focusing on the Creed for children, teens, and parents, with age appropriate content for each. The curriculum combines 6 self-led mini-series and/or 6 at-home Family Meetings and 5 at-church Family Sessions. Root's at-home experience is designed to meld into the fast paced lives of modern parents.
