PRAYER FOR OUR COUNTRY



By Archbishop John Carroll (1791)

We pray, O almighty and eternal God, who through Jesus Christ has revealed thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of your mercy, that your Church, being spread through the whole world, may continue with unchanging faith in the confession of your name.

We pray Thee, who alone are good and holy, to endow with heavenly knowledge, sincere zeal and sanctity of life, our chief bishop, the pope, the vicar of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the government of his Church; our own bishop, all other bishops, prelates and pastors of the Church; and especially those who are appointed to exercise among us the functions of the holy ministry, and conduct your people into the ways of salvation.

We pray O God of might, wisdom and justice, through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist with your Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude the president of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness and be eminently useful to your people over whom he presides; by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality.

Let the light of your divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government, so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety and useful knowledge; and may perpetuate to us the blessing of equal liberty.

We pray for his excellency, the governor of this state, for the members of the assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare, that they may be enabled, by your powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.

We recommend likewise, to your unbounded mercy, all our brethren and fellow citizens throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of your most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.

Finally, we pray to you, O Lord of mercy, to remember the souls of your servants departed, who are gone before us with the sign of faith and repose in the sleep of peace; the souls of our parents, relatives and friends; of those who, when living, were members of this congregation, and particularly of such as are lately deceased; of all benefactors who, by their donations or legacies to this Church, witnessed their zeal for the decency of divine worship and proved their claim to our grateful and charitable remembrance.

To these, O Lord, and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we beseech you, a place of refreshment, light and everlasting peace, through the same Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior. Amen.

St. Thomas The Apostle of India

I had a relaxing and wonderful trip back home over the last two months. After three years of my studies and the pandemic, with God's grace, finally I was able to visit my family


and friends. The most wonderful things about my visit were saying Mass for the first time in my home parish, officiating a wedding, and celebrating my nephew's Baptisms and First Holy Communions. And the highlight of my vacation was visiting many shrines and Basilicas - the memorable one was the visitation of St. Thomas's tomb and celebrating Mass at his Martyrdom place (St. Thomas Mount) where he was killed with a spear. After this tragic death, St. Thomas's body was interred in Mylapur, India. St. Thomas Basilica in Chennai, India is one of the three Churches that were built over the tomb of Jesus' apostles - St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, Santiago de Compostela Cathedral in Galicia, Spain, and St. Thomas Basilica in Chennai. According to the sources, the Portuguese built the present magnificent Cathedral over the tomb of St. Thomas in 1523 AD, and St. John Paul II Visited St. Thomas's tomb on 5th February 1986 and prayed there.

We usually commemorate St. Thomas feast on July 3rd but this year we do not celebrate his feast since it falls on Sunday. St. Thomas was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus and after Jesus' resurrection, he traveled to India to preach the Gospel. July 3rd was the special feast for the Church of India because God in His mercy consented to send one of His apostles to preach and convert the people of India. To witness St. Thomas's mission, still, there live St. Thomistic Christians in Southern India who believe that their ancestors were converted by St. Thomas.

The first thing that comes to our mind about St. Thomas was his skepticism about Jesus's resurrection. Though St. Thomas doubted Jesus' resurrection, his doubt paved the way to deepen our faith in the resurrected Lord. St. Gregory the Great says, "by this doubting of Thomas we are more confirmed in our belief, than by faith of other disciples."

What is the lesson we can learn from this great Saint? St. Thomas was the epitome of courage and a faithful disciple of Jesus. He figures prominently three times in the Gospel of John and from those three episodes, St. Thomas emerges as a courageous disciple of Jesus. We see his courage in John's Gospel. Two days after Jesus had heard about the death of Lazarus, Jesus wanted to go to Judea. Since the Jews were trying to stone Him, the other disciples were afraid for their lives and objected Jesus from going to Judea. However, St. Thomas said courageously, "Let us also go, that we may die with him (Jn 11:16)."

As we live in the modern age of science and technology, many of us hide our Christian identity and live as nominal Christians. We are afraid to stand up for the teachings of the Church. Imagine two thousand years ago, without knowing the language and culture, St. Thomas courageously embarked on a journey to the distanced land and witnessed the Gospel. As we honor St. Thomas, let us seek his intercession that we may have the same faith and courage that he had to witness the Gospel through our words and actions. St. Thomas - Pray for us.

Memories of an Altar Boy

In 1959 and in the fourth grade at Saint Agnes School, I became an altar boy. As I recall there were many of us that studied for this important and holy role. By study I mean that I had to learn the responses to the Latin Mass. Before Vatican II the Priest had his back to the congregation and the Mass was said in Latin. At our first meeting with Fr. John Carroll, we were given a card that had the Latin responses on both sides of this card. We had to memorize these prayers and responses. This was no easy task for a nine year old. My parents would drill me each night, and as time went on I mastered this. After weeks of preparation, I along with many others, was ready to serve my first Mass.

The first time I served Mass was on the side altar of the lower church with a newly ordained priest, Fr. William Helmick, who grew up on Belton Street. Eventually, I began serving on the main altar on weekdays and on Sundays. Sometimes we were late for school because they needed altar boys to serve at the 8:00 weekday Mass. Of course, this was a good excuse for being late to school. If altar servers were needed for a funeral, then we would be asked to serve and we were excused from school.

Holy Week was an exciting time to be an altar boy. There had to be over fifty of us that would fill up the first few pews on each side of the aisle during the Triduum. On Holy Thursday following the prayer after Communion, all would kneel

as the priest would incense the Blessed Sacrament on the altar. The Blessed Sacrament was then carried through the church to the place of reposition. That was the side altar in the upper church where the Baptismal Font is now located. Throughout the night different organizations such as the Holy Name Society as well as the altar servers would sign up for an hour to kneel before the Blessed Sacrament. This was done throughout the night as the church was open for adoration all night.

In 1978 while I was teaching at Saint Agnes School, I became friends with John and Ginny Schwamb whose son and daughter I taught. In 1990 I was invited to their 25th Wedding Anniversary. Shortly after that celebration, they found a picture of their wedding which took place at Saint Agnes Church. There I was on the altar serving at their wedding. Neither John, Ginny nor I knew that I was the altar boy at their wedding in 1966.

I thoroughly enjoyed my many years serving Mass at Saint Agnes Church.




June 25/26 Collection

St. Camillus Grand Annual




